The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in regular session on the above date at five-fifteen o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Weisman presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Chenu, Deise and Weisman.

ABSENT : None.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

The budget as prepared by the Secretary and accepted by the City Manager which contained no changes from the previous years was read and approved by the Board.

A letter was presented to the Board from John W. Morgan, an eligible on the list for Garbageman. It was properly moved by Commissioner Deise, seconded by Commissioner Chenu, and unanimously carried that the Secretary be instructed to write a letter to Mr. J. W. Morgan advising him that the request as presented in his letter was denied by the Board.

The granting of veterans preference as defined under Section 45 of the City Charter to John Frei was laid over until the next regular meeting of the Board.

A letter was presented to the Board from Patrolman Charles C. Wells, requesting that he be granted an additional leave of absence of ninety days because he is still in very poor health and unable to resume his duties.

It was properly moved by Commissioner Chenu, seconded by Commissioner Deise, and unanimously carried that Charles C. Wells be

granted an additional leave of absence of ninety days commencing July 31, 1932.

A request was presented to the Board through the Secretary for a clarification of the record of A. J. Wallquist. It was disclosed upon investigation that A. J. Wallquist was an employee in the Engineering Department and that on April 6, 1931, he was discharged for intemperance.

No further business appearing before the Board, they stood adjourned at five-fifty o'clock P. M. to meet again at the call of the Chair.
