SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL  
August 15, 1963

This having been the date set for hearing on a proposed ordinance establishing fees for reapportionment of assessments against property levied under the Streets and Highway Code, the matter was heard at this time.

There being no citizens in the audience desiring to speak on the proposed ordinance and upon recommendation of the City Manager, filed at the regular meeting of August 1, 1963, Councilman Mering moved that the following ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 2493, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE ADDING DIVISION 4 TO ARTICLE VII, CHAPTER 38, SACRAMENTO CITY CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1.

Sections 38.97, 38.98 and 38.99, under Division 4, Chapter 38, Sacramento City Code, are hereby added to read as follows:

Sec. 38.97. At such time as a property owner may request a reapportionment of an assessment or assessments under Sections 6480 to 6488 inclusive, or Sections 8740 to 8740.5 inclusive, of the Streets and Highways Code, a fee shall be charged to cover the costs of making the reapportionment.

Sec. 38.98. The fee to cover the costs of reapportionment shall be thirty dollars for advertising costs plus ten dollars for each parcel to which a portion of the assessment or assessments is to be reapportioned.

Sec. 38.99. The fee as above set forth shall be paid at the treasurer of the City of Sacramento at the time of the request for the reapportionment.

SECTION 2.

The Clerk shall publish this Ordinance once within 10 days after passage in the official newspaper of the City of Sacramento.

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After hearing the City Traffic Engineer comment on the report, Councilman Domich moved that the recommendation for viaduct freeway structure on the W-X Freeway between 8th and 25th Streets be approved.

During question on the above motion it was the sense of the Council to table the matter until the regular meeting of August 22, 1963, to enable each Councilman to review the report and accompanying maps.

Councilman Mering requested the City Traffic Engineer to obtain the State policy as to landscaping under viaduct freeways.

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In accordance with recommendation of the City Manager, Councilman Talkin moved that the Golden State Fireworks Manufacturing Company be permitted to display fireworks during the California State Fair from August 28 through September 9.
