Approving Cultural, Community and Natural Resources Grant for Mama Marks Park Improvement Project

BACKGROUND

- A. The California Natural Resources Agency has issued a notice of funding availability for the Cultural, Community and Natural Resources Grant program. Grants are available for projects that protect, restore, and enhance cultural, community, and natural resources.
- B. The City is proposing to make improvements to Mama Marks Park with the grant funds to include restoration of natural resources, reduction of greenhouse gas emissions by planting an urban forest, improving field and youth sports equipment as well as other park amenities including provision of safe drinking water, making Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements, and implementing water conservation and retention strategies across the park site.
- C. If the City's grant application is selected, the State requires the City authorize execution of the grant agreement with the State of California to carry out the project as part of the application submittal.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Authorizes the submission of a Cultural, Community and Natural Resources Grant application for the Margarett "Mama" Marks Park Improvement Project (the "Project") for the amount of \$801,795.
- Section 2. The City certifies that it understands the assurances and certifications required in the grant application for the Project.
- Section 3. The City certifies that there will be sufficient funds to operate and maintain the Project and that the City owns or will have control consistent with the land tenure requirements to implement the Project.
- Section 4. The City certifies that it will comply with the provisions of Section 1771.5 of the State Labor Code to require payment of prevailing wages for construction of the Project.

- Section 5. The City certifies that the Project will comply with any laws and regulations including, but not limited to, legal requirements for building codes, health and safety codes, disabled access laws, and environmental laws, and that prior to commencement of construction, all applicable permits will have been obtained.
- Section 6. The City certifies that it will work towards the Governor’s State Planning Priorities intended to promote equity, strengthen the economy, protect the environment, and promote public health and safety as included in Government Code Section 65041.1.
- Section 7. The City Manager, or his designee, is appointed as the City’s agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, payment requests and other documents which may be necessary for acceptance of the grant and completion of the Project.
