Plans and specifications for this project have been prepared. Staff recommends adoption of plans and specifications, and authorization to advertise for bids.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project will add to the existing drainage system by constructing approximately 293 lineal feet of 3 foot by 6 foot concrete box culvert, 293 lineal feet of 54 inch diameter concrete pipe and appurtenances. The area near the Royal Oaks Post Office has experienced flooding on a yearly basis. Based on the results of the City's Storm Water Management Model (SWMM), staff has determined that the additional pipes will significantly decrease flooding.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

The Environmental Services Division has determined that this project will not have a significant effect on the environment. A Negative Declaration has been published and filed pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The engineer's estimate of the construction cost of the project is \$134,740. The total project cost including design, inspection, and contingency is \$208,847. This project was approved in the Storm Drainage Fund Capital Improvement Program. The balance remaining in the project in 425-500-WA56, as of July 5, 1994, is \$375,400. Sufficient funds are available for this project.

A non-refundable fee of \$20.00 will be charged for each set of plans and specifications to cover reproduction costs.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This action is consistent with Chapter 58, Article III, Section 58.301 of the City Code governing advertising and bidding requirements.

MBE/WBE

This project will include MBE/WBE participation goals of 10.57% MBE and 9.5% WBE, as required by Resolution No. 93-619, relating to MBE/WBE participation goals and policies adopted by the City Council on November 2, 1993. Award of contract will be contingent upon the responsive low bidder either meeting the project MBE/WBE participation goals or making adequate good faith efforts towards meeting the project goals. Bids submitted which meet or exceed the MBE/WBE goals may be eligible for bid price preference up to a maximum of 7% or \$25,000, whichever is lower.
