Approving Engineer's Annual Report and Adopting the Neighborhood Water Quality District Annual Budget and Levying Assessment for Fiscal Year (FY) 2019/20

BACKGROUND

- A. The Neighborhood Water Quality District ("District") formerly known as the Meadowview Estates Maintenance District, as depicted in Exhibit A, was established by the City Council and approved by the property owners on July 23, 1991.
- B. The City Council established the District under Chapter 3.124 of the Sacramento City Code (Chapter 3.124); and has previously levied assessments on property in the District to pay for maintenance related to the water quality mitigation program and related services to be provided within the District, all in accordance with Chapter 3.124.
- C. The total assessment for Fiscal Year FY2019/20 is projected at \$69,268, with an expense budget of \$85,369 as shown on Exhibit B to the resolution and detailed in the Engineer's Report on file with the Public Improvement Finance Division, designated by the City Clerk's Office to be the repository of documents associated with special districts. The assessment in FY2019/20 is less than projected expenses due to the utilization of excess fund balance.
- D. Assessments for all subdivisions within the District are below the highest authorized amount for this district as shown on Exhibit B.
- E. On March 26, 2019, the City Council directed the Supervising Engineer of the Department of Public Works, designated by the City Council as the Engineer of Work for the District, was directed to file an annual report in accordance with Section 3.124.190 of the Sacramento City Code (Resolution No. 2019-0087).

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council finds and determines that the background statements A through E are true and correct.

Section 2. The City Council:

- The City Council hereby approves the Engineer's Annual Report for (a) FY2019/20 on file with the Public Improvement Finance (PIF) Division of the Department of Finance, designated by the City Clerk's Office to be the repository of documents associated with special districts.
- Adopts the annual budget set forth in the FY2019/20 Engineer's Annual (b) Report.
- (c) Levies the assessment set forth in the FY2019/20 Engineer's Annual Report and as shown in Exhibit B.
- Section 3. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to make any necessary budgetary adjustments associated with the approval of the Engineer's Annual Report for FY2019/20.

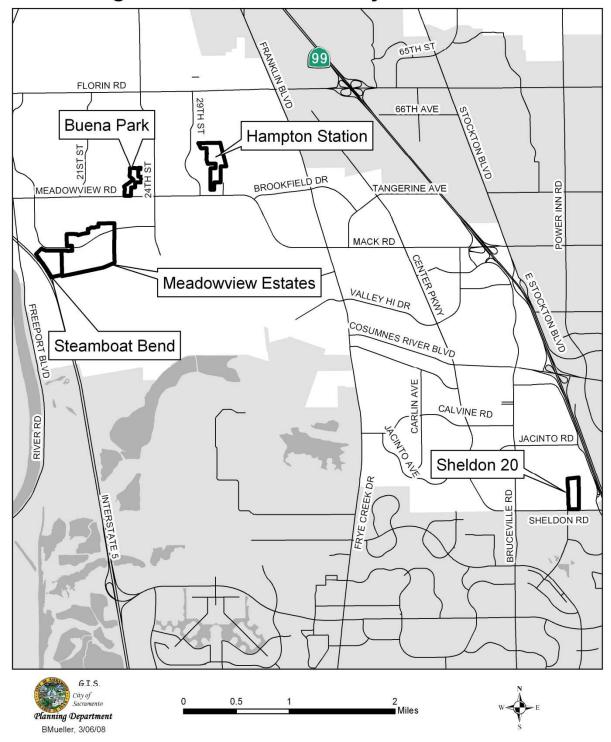
