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Having announced his intention so to do at Council Meeting on date of January 5, 1951, City Councilman Wood at this time addressed the Council and set forth his reasons for introducing the following ordinance as an amendment to Ordinance No. 1241, Fourth Series, creating the Disaster Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 1562, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 1241, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED DECEMBER 27, 1946, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO DISASTERS, AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY"; REPEALING SECTION 5, AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1: Section 2 of Ordinance No. 2141, Fourth Series, passed December 27, 1946, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Disaster Council. Membership.

The Sacramento Disaster Council is hereby created and shall consist of the following:

- A. The City Manager, who shall be Chairman and Commander.
- B. The City Engineer, who shall be Vice-Chairman and Vice-Commander and act in the absence of the Commander.
- C. A Director, who shall be appointed by the Chairman, with the advice and consent of the City Council, who shall assume active and unqualified control of all forces, equipment and material in case of an emergency or disaster, and shall have full authority in the formation and operation of the civilian defense plan for the city of Sacramento.
- D. The Chiefs of Division as hereinafter provided.
- E. Such other representatives of civic, business, labor, veterans, professional or other organizations as may be appointed by the Chairman with the advice and consent of the City Council.

That the Disaster Council shall meet at the call of the Chairman, at such times and places, and upon such notice as is reasonable. At a regular constituted meeting, the Council may consider all such matters as will be presented to it within the scope of its powers. That the City Clerk shall act as Secretary of the Disaster Council.

SECTION 2: Section 5 of Ordinance No. 1241, Fourth Series, passed December 27, 1946, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately; such emergency being the necessity of completing the re-organization of the Disaster Council and the Civil Defense Program at the earliest possible moment, in view of the present national emergency, and to promote the general welfare of the citizens of this city.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be published once in the official newspaper of said City of Sacramento.

Councilman Wood moved that foregoing ordinance be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Seymour.

A general discussion thereupon ensued after which roll call on the adoption of foregoing ordinance resulted as follows:

AYES: Councilmen Bahnfleth, Cooledge.

Mayor Geisreiter at this time made the following statement:

"I attended the League of California Cities' meeting last Thursday night when the new ordinance and resolution was approved and recommended for adoption by the League of California Cities and General Robinson, as a Uniform Code for all Cities and Counties of the State and as ordinance introduced by Councilman Wood will readily change the status of the Mayor in the Sacramento Civil Defense Plan, I feel this is a personal matter and consequently I therefore feel that I am disqualified to vote."

Roll call thereupon proceeded as follows:

NOT VOTING: Mayor Geisreiter.

AYES: Councilmen Hendren, Macaulay, Nielsen, Sayre, Seymour, Wood.

The Chair thereupon declared Ordinance No. 1562, Fourth Series, as having been adopted.

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Council adjourned at hour of 9:30 o'clock P. M.
