October 22, 1964

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at the hour of 7:45 o'clock p. m., Mayor McKinney presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

During discussion of foregoing report and application, it was the sense of the Council that City Code Sections 30.9 through 30.12 relating to private patrol activities be reviewed by the Health, Safety and Morals Committee, the City Attorney and the City Manager for possible revision.

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In accordance with report and recommendation of the Assistant City Manager, Councilman Nielsen moved that the request filed by Devlin, Diepenbrock, Wulff & Plant on behalf of George Gordon Pollock, Jr. and John P. Pollock for permission to hunt pheasants during the 1964 hunting season on the Pollock Hereford Ranch be granted with the stipulations that hunting privileges be granted to the owners of the Pollock Hereford Ranch and personally invited guests (not to exceed 15 persons per day), and that applicants hold the City of Sacramento and its officials harmless from any course of action arising out of the granting of said permit and that no rifle shooting be permitted. Seconded by Councilman Talkin and carried by the following vote:

Jones representing Sacramento Properties, Inc., from City Planning Commission denial of a rezoning application for the northeast corner of Amherst Street and Meadowview Road, from the R-3 Light Density Multiple-Family Zone to the C-2 General Commercial Zone, having been held and closed at the regular meeting of October 8, 1964, and continued to this date for decision, the matter was discussed at this time.

6664 Redevelopment Agency Activity Report for the month ending September 30, 1964, was received and ordered filed.

Councilman Murphy addressed the Council concerning juvenile activities and problems at Hughes Stadium and on K Street, noting that a recent administrative procedure had been agreed upon to eliminate the problem of "dragesters" in the downtown area.

Following a lengthy discussion and upon suggestion of Councilman Murphy the City Manager was directed to make a full report as to the present available manpower in the Police Department comparing the service from 1950 to present date and comparing other California cities of comparable population to determine if Sacramento Police Department growth has been consonant with the growth of the City in population and area.

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At the request of Mayor McKinney, the City Manager was instructed to review personnel classifications in the Police Department with a view toward providing an incentive for the recruitment of Patrolmen and expanding promotional opportunities.

In addition, Councilman Rouse thereupon requested that the City Manager report weekly for the next three weeks, as to the results of the new plan for curtailing juvenile "dragging" of the downtown area.

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Communication from the Sacramento Real Estate Board expressing dissatisfaction with Council action opposing proposition No. 14, was discussed at this time, and ordered filed.

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Councilman Nielsen read a reply to said letter relative to Federal Funds for Urban Renewal being endangered if Proposition No. 14, were passed.

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Communication from the Sacramento Area Council of Churches commending the City Council for action relative to Proposition No. 14, was received and ordered filed.

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Mr. John Steely appeared and expressed his opinion that the Councils' taking a stand on Proposition No. 14 may have been beyond their purview.

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Communication from the U. S. Department of Interior, requesting cooperation relative to conducting a study entitled "Legislation in Relation to Municipal Outdoor Recreation" in conjunction with a training program connected with San Jose State College, was received and referred to the City manager.

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Card of thanks from E. A. Fairbairn, City Manager, for flowers was received and ordered filed.

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Communication from Edgar H. Metcalf proposing that motorbikes be muffled and a speed limit of 15 miles per hour in residential areas for motorbikes be enforced, was received and referred to the City Manager.

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In accordance with report and recommendation of the Assistant City Manager, Councilman Talkin moved that the following resolution be adopted:
