

RESOLUTION No. 156

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

March 28, 1929

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento is a logical educational center and both the City and the district tributary to it are in need of increased college facilities; and

WHEREAS, there has been introduced in the State Senate Bill 830 for the purpose of providing the necessary legislation to make possible the establishment in Sacramento of a Four-Year College, to be known as the California State College; and

WHEREAS, the Act becomes effective conditional upon the voting by the people of the City of Sacramento of a bond issue of \$1,000,000 for buildings and equipment;


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Sacramento endorses Senate Bill 830 and urges upon the California Legislature the importance of the passage of this measure, and be it further
