SUBJECT: Amend the 1989-90 CIP Budget Proposal to Modify the Title
and Description of CIP TT33, Neighborhood Traffic Control
Program

SUMMARY

At the June 20, 1989, City Council hearing, it was directed by Council that the proposed project description be rewritten to add clarification and the project be retitled to more closely reflect the description.

BACKGROUND

It is proposed by staff that project TT33 be retitled - Neighborhood Preservation/Traffic Program and the description modified to read:

"Conduct 6 neighborhood traffic studies in residential areas on local and minor streets within the next fiscal year. These studies are intended to provide a more comprehensive, area by area, rather than street by street approach to neighborhood traffic management and will include citizen input. Upon completion of each individual study, council will be apprised of the results prior to implementation of traffic control measures within the specific study area."

In the Midtown area, the findings of the Midtown report will be approved by Council prior to the installation of the following signals; H & 19th (SO12), H & 24th (SO16), H & 26th (SS40), G & 25th (SS41), G & 27th (SS42), E & 21st (SS51), and F and 21st (SS52). The following sentence will be added to the description of these projects:

"This project will only be completed if the City Council approves a Midtown Neighborhood Traffic Plan as funded by CIP TT33."

Per Council direction staff will be returning with more specific information regarding the Midtown Neighborhood Traffic Plan timeframe and recommended citizens advisory committee composition.




