Subject: PROPOSED WATER SERVICE RATE AND DEVELOPMENT FEE ADJUSTMENT FOR 1989-90

SUMMARY

This report recommends adoption of the attached resolutions proposing a 19% increase in the water service rates to keep pace with operating costs and anticipated capital improvements. This rate increase includes the 5% in-lieu franchise fee that will be imposed on City utility services starting in 1989-90. In addition, a formula to increase the water development fee is proposed in order for the fee to keep pace with inflation. For the 1989-90 fiscal year, the increase would be 4.5%.

The water service rate increase of less than five cents per day for the average residential customer and the increase in the water development fees are to be effective July 1, 1989.

BACKGROUND

Water Service Increase. The Water Fund is an enterprise fund which supports the organizations of Water Production, Distribution, and Administration. The proposed budget for fiscal year 1989-90 includes operating expenditures of \$17,003,000 million and a capital improvement program of \$4,985,000.

The increase in water fund expenditures are split fairly evenly between operating and capital expenditures. The table below illustrates the major components of this rate increase.

The proposed fee structure, identified in the attached resolution, proposes 19% across-the-board increases for all water charges, with the exception of the water development fee, installation, lock box, and hydrant charges. The Development Fee will be addressed as a separate subject in this report. The installation, lock box, and hydrant charges have been reviewed and compared to actual costs. It has been determined that no increase is presently warranted.

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Water Development Fees. The increases proposed in the City development fee essentially follow the recommendations contained in 1985 Metcalf and Eddy report. This report identified expansion and financing alternatives. The development fee was initiated in April 1987; however, no escalation clause was included. As a result, the development fee has not kept pace with construction cost increases during the past two years. In order to keep pace with the increasing water infrastructure construction costs, it is proposed that the development fee be annually adjusted, as necessary, based on a composite of nation-wide and regional construction cost indexes published by the Engineering News Record (ENR). The construction cost indexes are determined using labor and common material costs and are published regularly by ENR. In order to change the current Water Development Fee structure, Section 47.321 of the Sacramento City Code must be amended.

Presently, a one-inch connection for a single-family dwelling unit has a fee of \$1,500. Non-residential fees are based on size of service with an added fee of \$2,500 per acre, since commercial water demands are generally higher and less predictable than residential demand. The proposed increase would raise all water development fees during 1989-90 by 4.5%. This increase is less than the 6% increase included in the 1989-90 proposed budget for development fees. Therefore, the revenue estimates for the water fund will be adopted downwards \$36,000 in the final budget if this rate is approved.

FINANCIAL

A breakdown of what the average monthly residential water user charge (6-7 room house) goes toward is shown below.

The proposed increase in water service rates is expected to generate \$3,026,000 in additional revenue to the Water Fund. Total revenue from the water service rates is projected to be \$17,798,000. The increased development fee is expected to generate \$135,000 in additional revenue. The total of these changes is reflected in the revenue schedule in the proposed budget (Schedule 6).

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Budget and Finance Committee approve an increase to the water service rates of 19% to cover increases in the operating budget and CIP program and a Water Development Fee increase for 1989-90 FY of 4.5%. It is further recommended that the Committee forward to the City Council the attached resolutions containing findings and amending the City of Sacramento Fee and Charge Report and the attached Ordinance amending City Code Section 47.321 for final adoption.

Section 47.321 of the Sacramento City Code is amended to read as follows:

47.321 Water System Development Fee

- General. Every lot, parcel or tract of land not connected to the City water system prior to January 1, 1980, shall be subject to a water system development fee, and no water service from such system shall be furnished thereto unless such charge has been paid. Such charge shall not apply if the fee established by the section, or the equivalent thereof has been previously paid by the owner, or a predecessor of such owner, or such property, or if the property meets the qualifications for an Infill site as established by City Council resolution. Payment of said connection fee shall be in addition to payment of all other applicable fees and charges (Ord. 4268, 1).

Beginning in January of 1989, and each January thereafter, the Director of Public Works shall adjust the Water Development Fee Schedule to compensate for the change in construction costs which has occurred since the previous adjustment. The Adjusted Water Development Fee Schedule shall be calculated by applying the following methodology:
