### LAW AND LEGISLATION COMMITTEE MEETING

June 19, 1986

The meeting was called to order at 4:05 p.m. by Chairman and Councilman Terry Kastanis. Also present were Councilmen Dave Shore, Bill Smallman and Doug Pope.

1. Request for Support of Assembly Bill 2692 Relating to Unlawful Manufacture of Controlled Substances. Lt. Joe Enloe of the Police Department was present to answer any questions regarding this matter. Dave Shore moved, Bill Smallman seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to support this bill.

2. Request for Support of Senate Bill 883 Relating to Custody of "Status Offender" Minors. Lt. Joe Enloe represented the Police Department on this matter also. Dave Shore moved, Bill Smallman seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to support this bill.

3. Ordinance Revising Section 40.514 of the City Code Relating to Delegation of the Signing of Final Subdivision Plans. Les Frink and Mel Johnson of the Department of Public Works were present to discuss this matter. It was explained that, for the sake of expediting final subdivision plans, Mel Johnson would appoint three designees to assist in the signing of these plans. This would be beneficial when Mel Johnson, now the only person authorized to sign, was out of the office or backlogged. It was moved by Dave Shore, seconded by Bill Smallman, and unanimously agreed that this ordinance be approved.

4. Ordinance Amending the "Right of Entry" Provisions of Chapters 9, 49 and 50 of the Sacramento City Code. Dick Antoine, Deputy City Attorney, was present to discuss this matter. Doug Pope moved, Dave Shore seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to approve this ordinance.

Two other items were brought before the Committee, as follows:

5. SB 2169 (Roberti) Regarding Prostitution. This bill was presented to the Committee by Dave Shore. He explained that the word "agreed" would be added to the law which would make it a crime to solicit, engage in or agree to engage in the act of prostitution. There was some discussion as to whether the Committee had previously voted on this matter. It was noted that the Committee had taken a stand regarding this matter prior to actual legislation being ini-

tiated. Dave Shore moved, Terry Kastanis seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to support SB 2169, if it is based upon the action of the Committee last year.

6. Bill SCR 82 Regarding a State History Museum. This matter was brought before the Committee by Bill Smallman. He explained that there is now no State history museum, and that it is essential, due to the fact that so many historical artifacts are in storage and which are falling apart. He also said it would be nice to have the museum located in Sacramento, but that it would be tough to get it. Bill Smallman moved, Dave Shore seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to support SCR 82.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:25 p.m.
