

# Resolution of Intention No. 19

Pursuant to the authority of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911," approved April 7, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof.

It is hereby resolved that it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Sacramento to order the following street work to be done, to-wit:

The improvement of the following in the City of Sacramento:

Curtis Way, Montgomery Way, 6th Avenue, 7th Avenue, 8th Avenue, 9th Avenue, 10th Avenue, 11th Avenue and Coleman Way, all from the easterly line of 24th Street to the westerly boundary of Wm. Curtis Park; Donner Way, from the center line of 24th Street (produced southerly) to the westerly line of Franklin Boulevard; and 24th Street, from the southerly line of Donner Way to the southerly line of Sutterville Road; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; and constructing and installing an electric street lighting system, consisting of 78 single lamp electroliers set upon foundations, each electrolier to be equipped with lamps, wires and lighting units, and all to be connected with a wiring system in underground conduit; and

The alley first east of Pacific Avenue, at a point south of Sutterville Road where electric current is supplied from Power Company's lines; by placing a control switch on the riser conduit already in place.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted therefor by the City Council, which plans and specifications are on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Notice is hereby given that serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments and bear interest at the rate of seven (7) per cent per annum will be issued hereunder in the manner provided by the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," the last installment of which bonds shall mature nine (9) years from the second day of July next succeeding ten (10) months from their date.

And whereas, in the opinion of said City Council said work is of more than local <sup>and</sup> ordinary public benefit, said Council hereby orders that the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon a district of lands, which district is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof.

The exterior boundaries of said district and the extent of the territory included therein are shown upon the map of said district adopted and approved by the City Council on December 22, 1927, which map is now on file in the office of the City Engineer and to which reference is hereby made for a particular description of the boundaries of said district and of the extent of the territory included therein;

Saving and excepting from the above bounden and described district the area of all public streets, alleys, ways, boulevards, courts and avenues included therein.

All persons objecting to said work, or to the extent of said assessment district, are required to file their objections in writing in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento, as required by law, and notice is hereby given to all persons interested that on the 12th day of January, 1928, at 8:00 o'clock P. M., in the Council Chamber of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, in the City Hall, on "I" Street, between 9th and 10th Streets, in said City, any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work and improvement may appear before said City Council and show cause ~~if~~ why the proposed work and improvement shall not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Resolution twice in the Sacramento Bee, a daily newspaper, as required by law.


