

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING
 HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO
 AUGUST 9TH, 1938.

The Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M. Mayor Tom E. Monk presiding and Roll Call answered as follows:
