THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL,

REGULAR MEETING,
JANUARY 8th,
1925.

The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.40 o'clock P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:-

The Minutes of Regular Meeting of January 2nd, 1925 were read and approved.

Report of City Manager recommending conference of City Council with officials of Pacific Gas & Electric Company and property owners on petition filed November 6th, 1924, relative to securing extended transportation facilities beyond East Lawn Line service was ordered filed, and Councilman John H. Miller moved that a Special Meeting of City Council be called for purpose on date of January 20th at hour of 3.30 o'clock P. M. Seconded by Councilman Frazier and carried by following vote:

Special Meeting called for January 20 3:30 P M to confer with P G & E Officials and Property owners re: Transportation facilities in East Sacto.

Communication from Mr. Fay Raymond resigning as member of the Ann Land Fund Commission was read to Council and ordered filed, Councilman John H. Miller thereupon moving that resignation be accepted, and George H. Cutter appointed for a term of five years from date of January 5th, 1925, in accordance with Ordinance No. 151 and 178 - 3rd Series. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

Mrs. A. C. Hart appointed member Ann Land Fund term five years vice Orin B. Whipple

Term having expired and re-appointment declined by Orin B. Whipple, Councilman Goddard moved that Mrs. A. C. Hart be appointed as member of Ann Land Fund Commission in accordance with Ordinance No. 151 and 178 - 3rd Series, for a term of five years from date of January 5th, 1925. Seconded by Councilman John H. Miller and carried by following vote:

Vote of thanks tendered retiring members of Ann Land Fund Com.

Motion of Mayor Elkus, Seconded by Councilman Brown that a vote of thanks be tendered retiring members of the Ann Land Fund Commission, namely Fay Raymond and Orin B. Whipple for their long and faithful service to the City of Sacramento was unanimously carried.

Mayor Elkus introduced the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 336, CITY COUNCIL.

"WHEREAS, in the Divine Wisdom of the Infinite God, MR. JAMES L. POPERT was called from our midst by death on date of January 6, 1925; and,

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"WHEREAS, in the passing of Mr. Popert the City has lost a citizen who was always interested in the welfare of the Municipality; a resident of the City for more than fifty years, and having served the City in the official capacity of Member of the Board of Trustees during years 1904, 1905, 1906 and 1907,

"THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Sacramento hereby expresses its tribute to the memory of this faithful and worthy citizen, and also extends on behalf of the People of the City its deepest sympathy to the members of his family."

Moved by Mayor Elkus, Seconded by Councilman Kiernan that foregoing Resolution be adopted and carried by following vote:

ABSENT: Royal Miller, and the Clerk directed to forward copy to members of the Family.

Councilman Bidwell thereupon addressed Council relative to life of Mr. James L. Popert and moved that when the Council Adjourn it Adjourn out of respect to memory of Mr. Popert. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Petition of property owners favoring and protest of Robert Swanston in the matter of petition of E. P. Harvey for reclassification of Lot at Northwest Corner 16th and Y Streets from Second Residential to Commercial were ordered filed and Mr. J. C. Carly addressed Council in opposition to foregoing petition, if such rezoning would permit erection of unsightly store buildings which would detract from the beauty of this intersection as an entrance to Homeland and Swanston's Subdivisions; Mr. Carly also protested versus the present use of the Northeast Corner of 16th and Y Streets for greasing and repair of autos in view of the fact that permit was granted for a gas and oil service station only. Discussed relative to meaning of service stations as defined under City Ordinance followed and Councilman Kiernan moved that matter be referred to City Manager for amendment to Ordinance relative thereto. Seconded by Councilman Goddard; Councilman Anderson addressed Council claiming that no distinction could be made between thin and heavy oils, and Councilman Bidwell stated some action should be taken as matter of permitting greasing and oiling under permit for service station was discussed at time of adoption of Zoning Ordinance, and as a substitute, Councilman Goddard moved that hearing be postponed one week. Seconded by Mayor Elkus and carried by following vote:

No protests having been filed, Councilman John H. Miller moved that petition of J. A. Lockhart filed December 18th, 1924 for the re-zoning of the East one-half of Lot 3, 13th and 14th, V and W Streets from Second Residential to Commercial District be granted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:
