

## RESOLUTION No. 135

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of  
January 31st, 1929

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission in the improvement of the Lincoln Highway between Placerville and Lake Tahoe will by-pass the Slippery Ford grade, re-routing necessitating the elimination of Strawberry from the main road; and,


WHEREAS, it has been required in the past for all mail going to Camp Sacramento to be received through the Post Office at Strawberry; and,

WHEREAS, Camp Sacramento will remain on the main highway as at present and is the logical location for a post office in that vicinity,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in order to accommodate the hundreds of citizens of this City who enjoy their vacations at Camp Sacramento, also to serve the many vacationists in that section, that the City Manager be hereby directed to immediately make application to the Postmaster General at Washington for the establishment of a Post Office and the appointment of a Postmaster at Camp Sacramento, El Dorado County, California, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to Sacramento's Representatives in Washington.
