

RESOLUTION No. 110

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

October 18, 1928

WHEREAS Referendum Measure No. 1 on the November ballot providing for the reapportionment of legislative districts according to the Federal Plan is of vital interest to the City of Sacramento and the Sacramento district, and

WHEREAS this measure, passed by a majority vote of all the counties in California with the exception of Los Angeles as an Initiative measure in 1926 and was later enacted into a law by the Legislature, is now being referred to the people for another vote as a Referendum to the measure upon the petition of certain interests in Los Angeles, and

WHEREAS this plan provides for an equitable distribution of legislative representation in the State Legislature by virtue of the fact that the representation from each legislative district in the lower house will be according to districts with not more than one senator to each district or three counties to each senator, a plan which is modeled after the plan of the Federal Government and which is now being followed by thirty states of the Union, and

WHEREAS if this plan is not adopted three per cent of the State's area will control the State Legislature because of a preponderance of population, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Sacramento City Council strongly endorse Referendum Measure No. 1 on the general election ballot to be voted upon November 6 as a measure of vital importance to the City of Sacramento and urge the voters of Sacramento to vote YES on this measure.
