**SUBJECT: FUNDING CONTRACT FOR THE START PROGRAM FROM THE  
COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO FOR FISCAL YEAR 1998-1999**

This report recommends that the City Council, by Resolution, authorize the City Manager to execute a contract agreement with the County of Sacramento for Fiscal Year 1998-1999 to accept funding in the amount of \$250,000 for the Sacramento START Program.

**SUMMARY**

The County of Sacramento, Department of Human Assistance, provides funding for the START program at 16 sites located throughout the City. The funding award from the County for fiscal year 1998-1999 is \$250,000.

## **BACKGROUND**

The City of Sacramento continues to be a statewide leader in providing after-school literacy programs. The START program creates a safe and supervised after-school literacy/enrichment program at 20 elementary school sites throughout Sacramento in collaboration with five school districts within the City's boundaries. The START Program is funded through a combination of city, county, state and federal government funds, school districts, private foundations, community-based organizations, and individual donors. The five participating school districts in the City of Sacramento include the Sacramento City Unified School District, Del Paso Elementary School District, Elk Grove Unified School District, Natomas Unified School District, and the North Sacramento School District.

This is the second year that the City has received funding for START from the County of Sacramento, Department of Human Assistance.

## **FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

The County of Sacramento, Department of Human Assistance is providing funding in the amount of \$250,000 for the START Program in FY 1998-99. This funding will be used at 16 school sites (Exhibit A). Notification of this funding grant in the amount of \$200,000 was received last spring. Therefore, \$200,000 of the award was included as part of the FY 1998-99 budget. The additional \$50,000 was not part of the FY 1998-99 budget and will be adjusted with this report. In addition, staffing for the START Program will be augmented as a result of the additional \$50,000 by adding a 1.00 full-time equivalent Recreation Supervisor position.

## **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

The START Program is consistent with the City Council direction of improving the quality of life in Sacramento for all families and for providing positive activities for Sacramento's youth. The program is also an excellent example of partnerships with the community, other government agencies, and the private sector to improve children's educational opportunities.


## **ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS**


Applicable City policies related to employment and purchasing will continue to be followed by the START Program management.



**WHEREAS**, the City of Sacramento provides a child care and development program, START, to the children of Sacramento to be funded in part by the County of Sacramento, Department of Human Assistance,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:**

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative, is authorized to execute an Agreement with the County of Sacramento (Agreement No. CW-49-99) and accept funding of \$250,000 for the START Program on behalf of the City of Sacramento.
