SUMMARY

Specifications for this project have been prepared. Approval of the specifications and authorization to advertise for bids is recommended.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Department of Utilities operates the Combined Waste Water Treatment Plant (CWTP) which is used to control storm water runoff during large storm events. Many of the circuit breakers used to protect the motors and associated electrical devices have experienced an increasing rate of failure and some replacement parts are no longer available. This project replaces those breakers with new equipment. Upon completion of this project, the electrical distribution system at CWTP will be safer and much improved.

The Environmental Services Division has reviewed this project and determined it to be categorically exempt.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The estimated total project cost, including all planning, design and construction costs is \$52,000. The current funding available in CIP #XC21 includes \$59,822. in Sewer funding (414) and \$30,000 in Storm Drainage funding (425) for a total of \$89,822. It is proposed that a final funding recommendation be made following the receipt of bids.

A non-refundable fee of \$30 will be charged for each set of plans and specifications to offset the cost of reproduction.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This action is consistent with Chapter 58, Article III, Section 58.301 of the City Code concerning advertisement for bid.


MBE/WBE EFFORTS
