SUBJECT: Status of Library Master Plan

SUMMARY

On February 24, 1981 at the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council, Councilman Connelly requested a report, due on March 17, 1981, relative to the status and time schedule for the Library Master Plan.

When the Master Plan Element for Library Physical Development was reviewed by the Planning and Community Development Committee in July 1980, a time frame of three to four months for updating the Plan was anticipated. The advent of the LAFCO Sphere of Influence Study punctuated the necessity for any library Master Plan to be a joint City/County Master Plan. The County Planning Department is currently reviewing reserve areas, some of which could have impact on several of the City library branches.

The necessary increase in the scope of our study and the lack of current census data require extending the time period for preparation of the plan. The City plan stipulates that a more accurate and detailed plan could be accomplished if developed concurrently with the City General Plan, which is scheduled for completion approximately June 1982. The administrative staff assigned responsibility for the development of the Joint City/County Master Plan are likewise responsible for the provision of library service in 29 outlets, development of fiscal budgets and other related administrative duties which preclude full time effort on the Plan on an ongoing basis.

CURRENT STATUS

1. Coordination between City and County Planning Departments has been established because of the overlap of City and County service areas and the need for a unified master plan for the Sacramento Public Library.
2. All library staff will have input to the Plan; however, specific staff members have been recommended by their peers to aid in data gathering and development of the report.

CURRENT STATUS (continued)

In accordance with guidelines recommended by the City Council October 10, 1980, the Master Plan will consider and make recommendations on the following specific items as well as review all City library service and facilities:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Library
 - a. Retention of "Regional" status.
 - b. Potential for expansion of present facility.
2. Greenhaven Site - Florin Road and Havenside Drive
 - a. Consideration for a new structure.
3. South Natomas Area
 - a. Search and acquire a site for future library.
4. Coolidge Branch Library
 - a. Relocation to larger facilities.
5. McKinley Branch Library/Clunie Clubhouse
 - a. Addition and renovation as part of Clunie Clubhouse plan.

RECOMMENDATION:


It is recommended that:

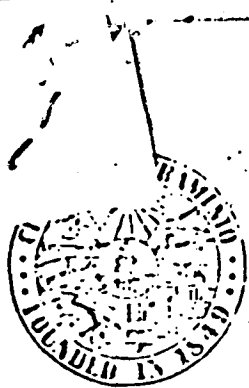


SUBJECT: Guidelines for Preparing the Draft Master Plan for Library Physical Development



Attached is a listing of guidelines to provide direction to City staff in preparing the Draft Master Plan for Library Physical Development. These guidelines are preliminary and subject to change based on the data, needs assessment and community and staff recommendations developed as part of hearings on the Draft Master Plan. The priorities and timing are not addressed in the attached listing but will be determined as part of the recommendations of the Master Plan.

The Master Plan process will include substantial involvement and participation by the community, City Council, Library administration, staff, etc. to assist in the development of such plan and assure proper review of recommendations.

We recommend that the City Council approve the attached guidelines and direct staff to proceed with preparation of the Draft Master Plan as noted above.

GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING THE DRAFT
MASTER PLAN FOR LIBRARY PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Overall Goal

Encourage and promote continuity in the development of long range plans for City library facilities and services. Such planning should reflect the needs of all of the public served in the City.

Preliminary Development Guidelines*

1. Development of a "branch library" on the Greenhaven Library site. Lease a facility at a nearby location as an interim measure until development of a permanent facility.
2. Continued use and expansion of Martin Luther King as a "regional library".
3. Relocate Bell College to a new permanent "community library" facility located north and west of the existing leased facility.
4. Development of a new "community library" facility in the South Natomas community, located to adequately serve existing developed areas as well as future annexed City areas. Lease a facility as an interim measure until development of a permanent facility.
5. Renovation of the McKinley Library as part of the Clunie Clubhouse rehabilitation project.
6. Review potential development of new larger facilities to replace and consolidate closely located libraries whose service areas have grown together, overlap, and strain capacity.
