Sec. 13.24 Suspension and Revocation - Appeals.

Any person aggrieved by the decision of the City Manager or the Manager's representative designated to conduct the hearing, in suspending or revoking a permit, or imposing a financial penalty pursuant to this article and the terms of the permit, may appeal such decision to the Council. The appeal shall be made by filing a written notice thereof with the City Clerk within ten (10) days after notice of the decision of the City Manager, or the Manager's designated representative, is mailed to the permittee and the persons requesting notice of the hearing pursuant to Section 13.23. The Council shall hold a hearing on the appeal and its decision thereon shall be final and conclusive. The Council may appoint a hearing examiner to hear and decide the appeal.

Sec. 13.23 13.25 Hours of Operation.

~~Dance~~Concerts subject to the permit requirements of this article shall not be permitted between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. ~~except when the dance concert permit obtained pursuant to article V of this chapter authorizes such exception and provided that the location of the establishment and the manner in which the dance concert is presented will not constitute a public nuisance or jeopardize or be injurious to the public health, safety and welfare.~~

Section 2.

Section 13.60 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 13.60 Application of Article.

This article shall apply to the issuance, denial or revocation of any permit required by Sections 13.01, 13.10, ~~13.20~~ or 13.30 of this chapter.
