

MINUTES OF CIVIL SERVICE BOARD  
CITY OF SACRAMENTO  
EXECUTIVE SESSION MARCH 13, 1973

The Civil Service Board met in executive session in the Personnel Department Conference Room at 1:30 p.m., with President James Alexander presiding.

Present: Members Alexander, Reynoso, Street, Woods, Yew.  
Absent: None.

The executive session was held to continue consideration of the request of William Motmans, et al., to restore the assignment classification of Patrolman (Detective Division). (Reference: Minutes of January 23, February 6, and March 6, 1973)

The draft of the proposed letter to the City Council from the Civil Service Board was presented to members of the Board for its review. After discussion, the following letter was finalized for transmittal to the City Council:

Members in Session:


The purpose of this letter is to urgently request that the City Council restore the class of Patrolman (Detective Division). When the City Council ratified the Memorandum of Understanding with the Sacramento Police Officers Association, effective July 1, 1972, the Council in effect abolished the class of Patrolman (Detective Division) in which there were six persons adversely affected.


When the City Council established this class in 1968 for the purpose of uniformity and proper police administration, seventeen persons were assigned to this class, and it was the intent of the Council that the class would eventually be eliminated through attrition as persons were promoted, retired, or reassigned. After extensive hearings, survey, and examination, this Board has found that the work performed by these six persons has not changed since the salary ordinance of 1968. Furthermore, we have determined that the services provided by these six persons continue to be beneficial to the citizens of Sacramento and contribute to proper police administration.


The Civil Service Board is advised by the City Attorney that, with the consent of the City and with the consent of the Sacramento Police Officers Association, the existing Memorandum of Understanding could be amended. The Board, therefore, requests that the City Council authorize the reopening of negotiations with SPOA to effect a modification of the existing agreement to permit the reestablishment of the class of Patrolman (Detective Division). The Civil Service Board further requests that, if this matter is referred to the Employee Relations Committee of the City Council, the members of the Committee meet with the Civil Service Board to discuss its recommendation.


