

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING  
HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO  
MAY 24TH, 1938.

The Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date, at the hour of 8:15 o'clock P.M. Mayor Tom B. Monk presiding and Roll Call answered by the following:

Councilmen Anderson, Arnold, Bidwell, Coughlin, Harry, Kunz, Monk.

ABSENT: Councilmen Truesdale, Welsh.

Call for the Meeting was ordered filed.

The purpose of the Meeting being the consideration of a proposed program of public improvements to be financed by Federal Grant, Bond Issue and Direct Taxation.

Mr. Dean addressed the City Council, referring to report by him to this Body on date of May 13th, 1938, and particularly commenting upon the following Bond Issue items thereof:

- (1) Paving Runways of and Lighting Airport.
- (2) Storm Sewers and Increase of Sump Capacity.
- (3) Library Addition.
- (4) Corporation Yard Buildings.
- (5) Water Tank, Mains and Improvements.

In addition to foregoing projects, City Manager verbally favored compliance with the request of a Citizens' group to include an Item for a Municipal Theatre in proposed Bond Issue and recommended that the sum of \$350,000 be designated for said purpose.

City Manager further reported that final action could not be taken in submitting the bond issue to the people until Congress had acted upon the present P.W.A. Appropriation, and that he anticipated other projects would be presented to the Council to be included in said bond issue.

Councilman Coughlin thereupon moved that the City Council, in view of the apparent uncertainty as to the final outcome of legislation in Washington, that we concur in the foregoing recommendations of the City Manager, recording ourselves as favorable to presenting to the Veterans the matter of the bond issues included in the program presented by him; that it be understood that the same is not entirely closed and that the City Council can, before proceeding to take the necessary legal steps, incorporate other matters in the bond issue if it so desires. Seconded by Councilman Kunz.

Councilman Kunz requested that those present, representing Veterans' Organizations, be permitted to address the Council on the subject before final action be taken, Councilman Coughlin concurring, and the Chair there-

upon extending the privilege of the floor to the Veterans' Committee.

Col. H. H. Brown, representing a joint Veterans' Committee, addressed Council requesting that an item of \$100,000.00 be included in proposed Bond Issue for a combined Veterans' Building, suggesting that it might immediately adjoin the Municipal Theatre, which was discussed at length, and it was the sense of the City Council that the Veteran and Theatre Committees should further confer concerning all phases of the proposal.

Roll Call on the adoption of foregoing motion resulted as follows:
