**RESOLUTION OF THE COMPENSATION COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
SACRAMENTO ADJUSTING THE COMPENSATION OF
THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011-12**


WHEREAS, Charter Section 29 provides for a Compensation Commission whose function shall be to establish the compensation for the Mayor, members of the City Council and the public members of City Boards and Commissions, and

WHEREAS, the Compensation Commission shall set a compensation for the Mayor and City Council that is reasonable and consistent with other cities similar in size and structure, and

WHEREAS, the Compensation Commission has reviewed current compensation data in comparison cities for the Mayor and City Council and determined that an adjustment to the Mayor and City Council salary and benefits is appropriate, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Compensation Commission of the City of Sacramento:

1. That except as provided in section 3, below, there shall be no adjustment to the salary and benefits of the Mayor and Councilmembers and that they shall remain at current levels for Fiscal Year 2011-12;
2. That the Compensation Commission shall commence a comprehensive review of Mayor and Councilmember salaries and benefits for potential adjustment for Fiscal Year 2012-13; and
3. That effective December 31, 2011, the Mayor and Councilmembers shall commence paying the required seven percent (7%) California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS) member retirement contribution.
