Summary:

This report provides an update on the City Strategic Plan objectives as directed by the Mayor and City Council.

Committee/Commission Action: None.

Background Information:

In August the Mayor/Council approved an updated City Strategic Plan which incorporated the results of the City Council and Charter Officer Retreat held in late July. As part of that action, staff was directed to review the strategic objectives identified during the retreat to determine if the preliminary due dates were feasible. In September 2005 the Mayor/Council approved the update to the City's Strategic Plan and approved incorporation of remaining objectives identified during the Council and Charter Officer retreat held in January.

At that meeting, the Mayor/Council requested that staff identify date specific due dates for each objective rather than general time frames. This report provides a monthly update on the status of the strategic objectives and includes specific due dates for each strategic objective as directed by the Mayor/Council.

Several objectives have either been completed, have made progress or are scheduled for completion as follows:

- A report on Parolee and Probationer Update was presented to the Mayor/Council on September 20, 2005.
- A report regarding Exclusive Right to Negotiate: 700 & 800 Block of K Street was presented to the Mayor/Council on October 11, 2005.
- A report presenting the Security Plan for City Hall was presented to the Mayor/Council on October 25, 2005.
- A report presenting an update on the Economic Development Strategy and 5-year Workplan was presented to the Mayor/Council on November 1, 2005.
- A report providing an Update on the General Plan was presented to the Mayor/Council on November 8, 2005.
- A report on Teen Gang Involvement is scheduled for presentation to the Mayor/Council on November 22, 2005.
- A report on Teen Programs is scheduled for presentation to the Mayor/Council on November 22, 2005.
- A report on the 10-year Plan to End Chronic Homelessness is scheduled for presentation to the Mayor/Council on December 6, 2005.
- A report on an Allocation Plan for a \$70 million general fund bond issuance is scheduled for presentation to the Mayor/Council on December 13, 2005.
