

ORDINANCE NO. 1540, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF SAID CITY TWO PROPOSITIONS FOR INCURRING BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID CITY FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION OF THE FOLLOWING MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS, TO-WIT: (A) SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS; (B) EASTERN APPROACH SUBWAY AND STREET IMPROVEMENT; DECLARING THE ESTIMATED COST OF SAID MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS, AND EACH THEREOF, THE AMOUNT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF SAID INDEBTEDNESS TO BE INCURRED FOR EACH THEREOF, AND THE MAXIMUM RATE OF INTEREST TO BE PAID THEREON, MAKING PROVISION FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES, FIXING THE DATE OF SAID ELECTION, THE MANNER OF HOLDING THE SAME, PROVIDING FOR NOTICE THEREOF AND CONSOLIDATING SAID SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION WITH THE GENERAL STATE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 1950.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Sacramento, by resolutions duly passed and adopted at a regular meeting of said Council on the 8th day of September, 1950, by affirmative vote of more than two-thirds of all of its members on each Resolution, did determine that the public interest and necessity demand the acquisition, construction and completion of the municipal improvements hereinafter mentioned, and each of them, and did further determine the cost of each of said proposed municipal improvements will be too great to be paid out of

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the ordinary annual income and revenue of said municipality which resolutions were duly entered on the minutes of said Council and by ayes and noes recorded in its journal of proceedings and authenticated by the signature of the presiding officer of said Council and by the City Clerk, and are now on file and of record in the City Clerk's office of said City; now therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, as follows:

SECTION 1. That a special municipal election be, and is hereby ordered, called, and will be held in said City of Sacramento on Tuesday, the 7th day of November, 1950, at which election shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said City the several questions of incurring bonded indebtedness of said City for the objects and purposes set forth in the following propositions, and each of them, as follows, to-wit:

PROPOSITION A (SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS).

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$4,400,000.00 for the object and purposes of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to-wit: Improvement of the municipal sewerage system including construction of a sewage treatment plant, trunk sewers, connecting sewers, pipes, pump stations, pumping equipment, machinery, property, easements, and all other works or structures necessary or convenient for the collection, transmission, and disposal of sewage by the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION B (EASTERN APPROACH SUBWAY AND STREET IMPROVEMENT).

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness

in the principal amount of \$2,028,000.00 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to-wit: Construction of a subway at the Eastern Highway Approach to the City of Sacramento, enlargement and alteration of subways, overpass and grade separation structures, pedestrian ways; street work including the improvement of streets and public ways, the widening, enlarging, extending, relocating, grading and surfacing of streets, sidewalks, curbs, gutters, embankments, retaining walls, street lighting facilities, traffic signals, drainage facilities and pipes; necessary property, easements and rights-of-way; and all other structures, work or works, necessary or convenient for the improvement of the public street system of the City of Sacramento?

That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition A (Sewage Treatment Plant and Sewerage System Improvements) is the sum of \$4,400,000.00 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$4,400,000.00. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition B (Eastern Approach Subway and Street Improvement) is the sum of \$2,028,000.00 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$2,028,000.00.

SECTION 2. That said Council does hereby submit to the qualified electors of said City of Sacramento at said special municipal election the said propositions, and each of them, set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance, and designates and refers to said propositions in the form of ballot hereinafter prescribed for use at said municipal election, to be consolidated with the

General State Election as hereinafter provided for. Said Council proposes to issue and sell bonds of said City of Sacramento in the amounts and for the objects and purposes specified in said propositions and each thereof, if two-thirds of the qualified electors voting on each separate proposition at said special municipal election shall vote in favor of each of said propositions; provided, however, that the votes cast for and against each of said respective propositions shall be counted separately and when two-thirds of the qualified electors voting on any one of such propositions vote in favor thereof, such proposition shall be deemed adopted and bonds of the City of Sacramento in the aggregate amount specified in the proposition or propositions which carried by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the qualified electors of said City voting on such proposition or propositions at said election shall be issued and sold for the purposes specified in the proposition or propositions which received such affirmative two-thirds vote. Said bonds shall be negotiable in form and of the character known as Serial, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding five (5) per cent per annum payable semi-annually, which coupon rate shall not be exceeded in the issuance of said bonds, but may be decreased if the Council shall obtain bids for the purchase of said bonds at any lower coupon rate, and said bonds shall be offered for sale on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the City of Sacramento. Provision is hereby made for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as follows, to-wit: The Council of the City of Sacramento shall, at the time of fixing the general tax levy and in the manner for such general tax levy provided, levy and collect annually each year until said bonds are paid, or until

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there shall be a sum in the treasury of said City set apart for that purpose to meet all sums coming due for principal and interest on such bonds, a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on such bonds as the same becomes due, and also such part of the principal thereof as shall become due before the proceeds of a tax levied at the time for making the next general tax levy can be made available for the payment of such principal. Said tax shall be in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal purposes and shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as other municipal taxes are collected and be used for no other purpose than the payment of said bonds and accruing interest.

SECTION 3. Said special election shall be held and conducted, and the votes thereof canvassed, and the returns thereof made, and the result thereof ascertained and determined as herein provided, and in all particulars not prescribed by this ordinance said election shall be held as provided by law for the holding of municipal elections in said City.

SECTION 4. All persons qualified to vote at municipal elections in said City of Sacramento upon the date of the election herein provided for shall be qualified to vote upon the propositions, and each of them, submitted at said election.

SECTION 5. Each voter may vote on any or all of said propositions. Each voter to vote for any proposition hereby submitted and for incurring said bonded indebtedness shall stamp a cross (X) in the blank space opposite the word "YES" on the ballot to the right of said proposition, and to vote against any proposition and against incurring said indebtedness shall stamp a cross (X) in the blank space opposite the word "NO" on the ballot to the right of said proposition.

SECTION 6. That said Special Municipal Election which is hereby called shall be and the same is hereby consolidated with the General State Election to be held within the City of

Sacramento on November 7, 1950, which said election is to be held throughout the State of California pursuant to Section 950 of the Elections Code, and notice thereof shall be given by the County Clerk of Sacramento County pursuant to Section 668 of the Elections Code and pursuant to the proclamation of the Honorable Earl Warren, Governor of the State of California, pursuant to Sections 1001 to 1003, inclusive, of the Elections Code. That the consolidation of said municipal election is made pursuant to the provisions of Sections 10050 to 10058 inclusive of the Elections Code.

That the Board of Supervisors is hereby requested to allot space on the ballot of the general election to the City of Sacramento, a municipal corporation, for the purpose of conducting said Sacramento City Municipal Election and to print thereon Propositions A and B to be voted on at said General State Election, which said propositions shall appear in words and figures as follows:

CITY OF SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL PROPOSITIONS.

A. SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS.

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$4,400,000.00 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to-wit:  
 Improvement of the municipal sewerage system including construction of a sewage treatment plant, trunk sewers, connecting sewers, pipes, pump stations, pumping equipment, machinery, property, easements, and all other works or structures necessary or convenient for the collection, transmission, and disposal of sewage by the City of Sacramento?

B. EASTERN APPROACH SUBWAY AND STREET IMPROVEMENT.

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$2,028,000.00 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to-wit:  
 Construction of a subway at the Eastern Highway Approach to the City of Sacramento, enlargement and alteration of subways, overpass and grade separation structures, pedestrian ways; street work including the improvement of streets and public ways, the

SECTION 7. That notice of said election, stating the time and place thereof and the names of said election officers and precincts into which said City is divided are as stated in the notice given by the County Clerk of the State Election.

SECTION 8. That the location of precincts, polling places, election officers and voting booths of such consolidated election shall be in accordance with the order of the Board of Supervisors of Sacramento County.

The polls at the polling places hereinafter designated shall be opened at seven o'clock A.M. of said day of election and shall be kept open continuously thereafter until seven o'clock P.M. of said day of election, when the polls shall be closed (except as provided in Section 5734 of the Elections Code), and the election officers appointed by said Board of Supervisors shall thereupon proceed to canvass the ballots cast thereat.

That sample ballots showing the propositions to be voted upon shall be mailed to each and every registered voter residing within the boundaries of said City of Sacramento, in accordance with the provisions of Section 198 of the Charter, at least 5 days before said election, and shall be mailed by the County Clerk, the Clerk of said General State Election.

SECTION 9. That the City Clerk shall publish, in accordance with Section 9755 of the Elections Code a synopsis of the propositions to be voted upon, atleast twice before the date of election in the "Sacramento Union", the official





canvass the ballots cast for or against said municipal propositions A and B, hereby submitted to vote, and to officially notify the Council of the result of the vote thereon. That City Council, on receipt of official notice of the results, shall cause the same to be fully spread in the Journal of this Council and shall declare the result thereof of each proposition as won or lost, in accordance with the official result thereof.

SECTION 11. This ordinance shall be forthwith entered upon the minutes of this Council and in the Ordinance Book of said City. This ordinance, being an ordinance calling and ordering an election, shall take effect from and after its final passage and approval.


SECTION 12. That this ordinance calling an election and consolidating the same with the General State Election shall be published once a day for seven (7) days in the "SACRAMENTO UNION", the official newspaper, first publication to start within ten (10) days after passage.
