SUBJECT: American River Watershed Feasibility Study By U.S. Corps of Engineers

SUMMARY

This report recommends (1) that the "American River Watershed Study" be added to the 1987-88 Capital Improvement Program, (2) that funds be allocated to the project, and (3) that the City Manager be authorized to execute the "American River Watershed Investigation For Flood Control and Water Supply Local Cost-Sharing Agreement" with the State of California in an amount not to exceed \$214,000.00.

BACKGROUND

On September 15, 1987, the Council adopted Resolution No. 87-743 to support the State Reclamation Board sponsorship and intent to pay 50% of the non-Federal share of the cost of the Corps of Engineers Feasibility Study of the Lower American River Flooding Problem. On January 19, 1988 Resolution No. 88-059 was adopted supporting 200 year level of flood protection along the American River and in Natomas and recommending the completion of the Feasibility Studies on flood protection alternatives.

The City of Sacramento, the Counties of Sacramento, El Dorado, Placer, and Sutter, as well as the Reclamation District 1000 and the American River Flood Control District, must now enter into a local cost-sharing agreement with the State of California (State) to permit the State to cost-share with the Corps of Engineers (COE) the Feasibility Study on the American River Watershed. The State/COE cost-sharing agreement is scheduled to be executed on or before April 15, 1988. It is

critical that the local cost-sharing agreement be completed by that date (such that the Feasibility Study can be maintained). The State will not execute the State/COE cost-sharing agreement until the local participants have executed the local cost sharing agreement with the State. Therefore, it is essential that the City of Sacramento authorize the City Manager to execute the "American River Watershed Investigation for Flood Control and Water Supply Local Cost-Sharing Agreement."

FINANCIAL

The City's share of the total cost of this project will be 17.12% of the total cost, or \$214,000.00. Funds for the new capital improvement project titled "American River Watershed Study" will be transferred from the Storm Drainage Contingency (4-25-710-7012-4999), which has a current balance of \$816,516, to the new capital improvement project (4-25-500-XXXX-4801). Though it is not planned at this time that City staff will be performing work as part of the core study group, there is the possibility that such work may be undertaken in the future. Should that occur, the approval of additional funds for which the City will be reimbursed by the State will be requested.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Budget and Finance Committee approve the creation of this new capital improvement project, the transfer of funds, and the authorization for the City Manager to execute the American River Watershed Investigation for Flood Control and Water Supply Local Cost-Sharing Agreement with the State of California, and forward the attached Resolution to the full City Council with a recommendation for approval.
