SUMMARY

It was on the advice of the Sacramento City Police Department, and with the concurrence of the management of the Sacramento Community Center, that in 1977 the Community Center initiated the utilization of Event Security personnel for security services, and on the advice of the City Attorney's office began phasing-out the use of off-duty police officers during facility rock shows.

At the present time, the Community Center complex utilizes no off-duty police officers, and uses only Event Security personnel. We do, however, use a liaison officer, who is an officer of the Sacramento Police Department, for certain types of shows.

It is our recommendation that we extend the current Agreement through November 10, 1983, and renew the existing Agreement we have had with Event Security for the past five years for an additional twelve month period. Revisions in the currently existing Agreement include: (1) a reasonable hourly wage increase; (2) an increase in comprehensive general liability coverage, and; (3) an increase in limits of workers' compensation coverage.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

For many years the Memorial Auditorium, and later the Sacramento Community Center, had always relied on the Sacramento Police Department's off-duty police officers to provide security for events held here, while at the same time relied upon private security service firms for exhibit type shows. These two security services had never been scheduled to work in the facility at the same time.

From 1973 to 1977 the number of off-duty police officers interested in off-duty work of this nature had diminished to the point where we had difficulty scheduling enough officers to work these events. At this point, we requested of Mayor and Council, and with their approval, called for bids from agencies which could provide sound event security.



BACKGROUND INFORMATION (Continued)

Following numerous meetings with both the Sacramento Police Department and security agencies, a decision was reached with reference to the agency which could best provide this service for the complex. A specialized service of event security was needed; at that time bids were requested. After receiving only one bid, it was determined that only Event Security could fulfill the needs of the complex. For the past five years, the Sacramento Community Center complex has had an Agreement with Event Security for security services.

FINANCIAL DATA

Security for events is a charge that is borne totally by the agency promoting within the Community Center or Memorial Auditorium. There is no cost whatsoever to the City of Sacramento for security services. We do, however, keep a close scrutiny on this area of expense to ensure that the security costs do not become prohibitive for licensees in the promotion of events in the Sacramento Community Center. Due to the required increases in Event Security's manufacturers/contractors, and personal injury liability premium coverage, as well as increased workers' compensation and normal increased wage rates, Event Security is compelled to request an hourly rate increase of .25¢/hr. for security guards and .50¢/hr. for security guard supervisors. The Community Center management feels this rate increase is justified and is a reasonable request at this time.


RECOMMENDATION

Pursuant to Paragraph #6 of the existing Agreement, it is recommended that the City Council extend the current Agreement through November 10, 1983, and adopt the attached Resolution authorizing the City Manager to renew the exiting Agreement with Event Security to provide security services for the Sacramento Community Center and Memorial Auditorium for the period from November 11, 1982, to and including November 10, 1983.

# RESOLUTION NO. 82-757

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO RENEW THE EXISTING AGREEMENT WITH EVENT SECURITY INC. FOR SECURITY SERVICES AT THE SACRAMENTO COMMUNITY CENTER AND MEMORIAL AUDITORIUM FOR AN ADDITIONAL 12-MONTH PERIOD.

WHEREAS, the security services to be rendered pursuant to the subject agreement are compensated by revenues derived from the promotion of events at the Sacramento Community Center and Memorial Auditorium and therefore involve no direct costs for the City; and,

WHEREAS, the provisions this agreement will insure that sufficient and professional security services are available for events at the Sacramento Community Center and Memorial Auditorium;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO that:

The City Manager is hereby authorized to renew that certain agreement for security services for the Sacramento Community Center and Memorial Auditorium for the period from November 11, 1982, to and including November 10, 1983.
