After general discussion by members of the Board, Mr. Deise moved that the position classification of General Shop Foreman, Corporation Yard, be established with a scale of \$2.00 per hour, pending approval of Union contract now under negotiation; seconded by Mr. Root and motion carried.

CARPENTER
Wage Scale

Communication from the Sacramento-Yolo Counties District Counsel of Carpenters with reference to a $12\frac{1}{2}\%$ per hour increase for Carpenters, with a minimum Foreman scale of \$2.00 per day more than the Journeyman scale, was ordered filed.

Mr. Deise moved that the Board recommend to the City Council that the prevailing scale of \$2.12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per hour be established for the classification of Carpenter and a scale of \$2.37 $\frac{1}{2}$ per hour for the classification of Foreman; seconded by Mr. Root and motion carried.
