1. Parking Enforcement in Outer Areas of the City

DISCUSSION:

Mark Morgan, Parking Division Manager, summarized the staff report. He reviewed the background of current parking enforcement practices and outlined the feasibility of providing parking enforcement beats south of Fruitridge Road. Councilman Kastanis complained that two City Council districts are in effect left without any enforcement despite problems. Chairperson Robie outlined the attempts she had made to get staff to address the problem of trucks and trailers parked on streets in her district.

Mike Hanamura, Nuisance Abatement Manager, explained that a pilot Abandoned Vehicle Program is underway and could possibly be expanded to other areas of the City. He agreed to return to Committee in two weeks with suggestions for solving the problem south of Fruitridge.

Chairperson Robie stated that the staff recommendations as presented in the report were unacceptable. She expressed concern that the problems not be left "status quo" but that staff put together a viable solution to the parking enforcement problem.

Councilman Shore suggested that staff report back on the possibility of having Code Enforcement Officers issue parking citations while out in the field on other matters.

Mel Johnson, Director of Public Works, explained that Mr. Morgan's report only identified the costs associated with providing uniformed parking enforcement in outlying areas and illustrated that the program would not pay for itself. If the Committee wishes to implement such a program, they could recommend to the City Council that two positions be added.

REPORT(S) BACK:


A report from Code Enforcement and the Police Department regarding the Abandoned Vehicle Removal Program and parking enforcement in the outlying areas is due back July 15, 1986. The report will include an analysis of whether Code Enforcement Officers can issue parking citations when they see violations.

ACTION:

It was moved by Councilman Kastanis and seconded by Chairperson Robie that the staff recommendations be rejected and that staff be directed to return in two weeks with a report that treats the entire City equally regarding parking enforcement and abandoned vehicles.
