

Sacramento, California,

November 20, 1931.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at eight o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
ABSENT : None.

An opinion by the City Attorney was received and read regarding the temporary appointment of James Darwin, an employee in the Police Department.

It was properly moved by Commissioner Weisman, and seconded by Commissioner Maloney that, in accordance with the opinion rendered by the City Attorney, the request of Mr. James Darwin be denied. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
NOES: None.

The following resolution, adopted by the Board at their meeting of November 4, 1931, was read for the second time:

RESOLVED: That every applicant claiming preference under Section 45 of the City Charter be required to furnish an honorable discharge, or the equivalent thereof, at the time the applicant appears at the personal fitness test or within thirty days after any examination has been completed by the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That unless this provision is complied with, preference will not be allowed.

An opinion was secured from the City Attorney wherein he held that the Board has undoubted right to establish reasonable

rules and regulations as to the furnishing of evidence that said applicant is entitled to said preference and also as to the identity of the applicant. In accordance with the opinion rendered, it was properly moved by Commissioner Maloney and seconded by Commissioner Weisman that the adoption of the resolution be made and the resolution be made a part of the Civil Service Rules and Regulations. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
NOES: None.

Upon motion of Commissioner Maloney the Secretary was instructed to announce that an examination for Water Department Inspector be held, and that applications be closed December 5th at five o'clock P. M.. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
NOES: None.

No further business appearing before the Board, they stood adjourned at ten o'clock P. M. to meet again at the call of the Chair.
