Adopt a Resolution: 1) authorizing and directing the City Manager to execute Supplemental Agreement Number 2 with DCM Group, Inc. to revise the scope of work and schedule for an additional cost of \$72,000 and to pay a sum of \$144,000 for all services provided from December 4, 2004 through December 31, 2006, and 2) resetting the City Manager's Supplemental Agreement authority.

Summary:

This report requests approval of Supplemental Agreement Number 2 with DCM Group, Inc. in the amount of \$72,000 to continue labor compliance monitoring of City construction projects and provide technical support to the Contract Services Group of the Engineering Services Division, Department of Transportation. Supplemental Agreement Number 2 also stipulates that the consultant accepts \$144,000 as full compensation for all work completed for labor compliance and technical support services from December 4, 2004 through December 31, 2006.

Background Information:

In January 2005, the City Manager authorized a \$48,000 consultant service agreement with DCM Group, Inc. (DCM) to provide labor compliance field investigation and monitoring services for City construction projects (City Manager Agreement (CMA) #2005-0029). These services were necessary to facilitate staff effort in meeting regulatory requirements of the City's approved Labor Compliance Program (8/95).

In November 2005, the original consultant services agreement was supplemented by \$24,000 and the scope of services was modified to include technical support and contract administration duties in support of the Contract Services Group of the Engineering Services Division, Department of Transportation (CMA #2005-0029-1).

Supplemental Agreement Number 2 with DCM is required to continue labor compliance monitoring of City construction projects and provide technical support to the Contract Services Group of the Engineering Services Division, Department of Transportation. The supplemental agreement adequately funds the amended scope of work reflecting additional compensation for the new duties assigned to DCM as well as maintains base level compensation for the duties under the original agreement.

Financial Considerations:

Approving Supplemental Agreement Number 2 will increase the agreement amount from \$72,000 to \$144,000. The cost of the services to be performed by DCM will be fully funded through capital improvement projects, as services are needed.

Environmental Considerations:


Pursuant to Section 15378 (b) (3), this is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act.


Policy Considerations:

**APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NUMBER 2 WITH DCM GROUP, INC
FOR LABOR COMPLIANCE FIELD INVESTIGATION SERVICES**

BACKGROUND
