Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sacramento, having in open session on the 31st day of **March** 1927, opened, examined, and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the doing of the street work hereinafter mentioned,

Hereby rejects all of said bids, except that next hereinafter mentioned, and hereby awards the contract for said work to the lowest regular, responsible bidder, to-wit:

To **McGillivray Construction Company**
at the prices specified in **its** proposal for said work now on file.

The work herein referred to is the improvement of **that portion of 65th Street** lying west of the center line thereof, from a point 12 feet southerly from the center line of Folsom Boulevard to the center line of 14th Avenue; 61st Street, from the manhole in place on 5th Avenue to a point 8 feet south of the center line of 2nd Avenue; and 2nd Avenue, from the easterly line of 61st Street to the westerly line of 65th Street,

RECORDED
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in the City of Sacramento to the extent, with the materials and in the manner set forth in Resolution of Intention No. **2149**, passed and adopted by said City Council on **February 3,** 1927, reference to which Resolution of Intention is hereby made for a description of said work and improvement **and of the district to be assessed for the costs and expenses of said work.**

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish notice of this award twice in the **Sacramento Union,** a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City of Sacramento, as required by law.
