**SUBJECT:** Resolution Suspending Competitive Bidding and Execution of Agreement with Benson Fence Co. for Repair of Existing Fencing and Installation of Fence and Gates Around Vegetal Waste Shredding Facility Located at 28th and A Street Landfill

### SUMMARY

This report recommends the City Council adopt a resolution suspending competitive bidding and authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement not to exceed \$6,153 with Benson Fence Company to repair existing fence and to install fence and gates associated with the Vegetal Waste Shredding Facility located at the 28th and A Street Landfill.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Vegetal Waste Shredding Facility access road was completed by private contractors on June 6, 1984. With the completion of the roadway, the repair of the existing fence line alongside the roadway can now be completed and a security fence and associated gates can be erected around the existing shredding facility.

During construction of the facility some vandalism occurred, i.e. breakage of switches and dials on electrical panels, therefore requiring the security fencing to prevent any further vandalism.

The Waste Removal and Building Maintenance Divisions of the City developed the design of the fence and gates. The Building Maintenance Division also secured the following informal bids on the project:

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It is staff's recommendation that because of the reasons presented in this report, it would be in the best interests of the City to waive formal bidding procedures and enter into an agreement with Benson Fence Company for this work.

FINANCIAL DATA

In FY 1983-84, the City Council approved this Capital Improvement Program as part of the Waste Removal Division budget. Funding was to be from the Certificate of Participation Program. There is a sufficient fund balance in the overall program to cover the costs of the required fencing.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that competitive bidding procedures be suspended and that the City Manager be authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with Benson Fence Company for a figure not to exceed \$6,153 by passage of the attached resolution.

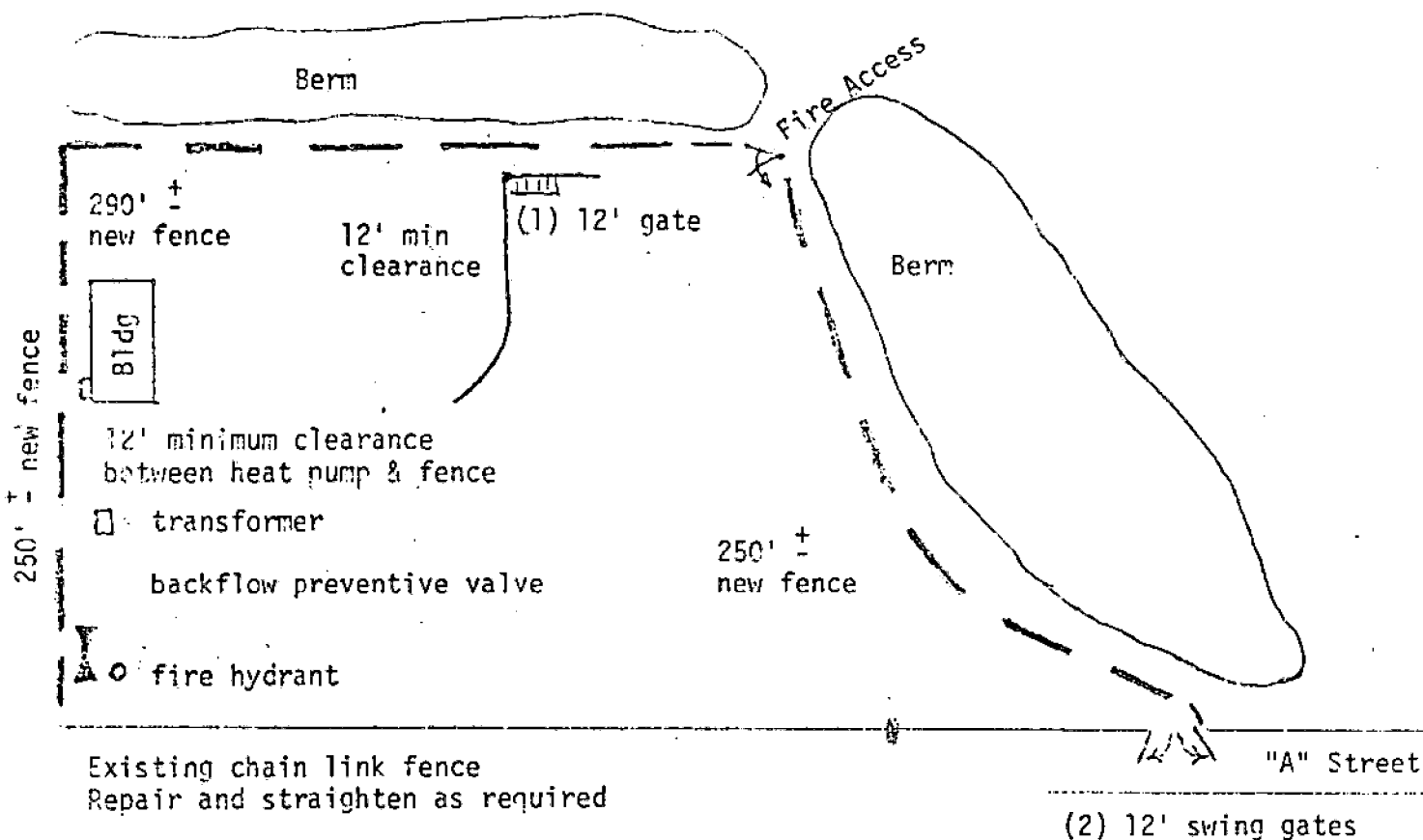
PROJECT: Vegetal Waste Security Fence

PROJECT FUNDING: \$15,000

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Install 790 linear feet of 6 foot high, 9 gauge chain link with 3 strand barbed wire topped fence around the Vegetal Waste Facility as shown on diagram below. All fencing is to have top rail and bottom tension wire. Installation includes two (2) gates and repairing or straightening existing fence lines as required.

Further resolved, that the City Manager and City Clerk are authorized and directed to enter into an agreement not to exceed \$6,153 with Benson Fence Company for required fence work at the Vegetal Waste Shredding Facility at the 28th and A Street Landfill.
