**SUBJECT: Revenue from Concession Operations in William Land Park**

**SUMMARY**

This report provides information on revenue deposited in the Fairytale Town Fund and recommends adoption of a policy for the use of these funds. An amendment to the FY 1986-87 City budget is required for improvements to Fairytale Town and the surrounding area.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. The plan detailing the hierarchy of uses of Fairytale Town Special Fund revenue is hereby approved.
2. The FY 1986-87 capital improvement projects and facility maintenance projects are hereby approved as follows:

SUBJECT: Revenue from Concession Operations in William Land Park

SUMMARY

This report provides information on revenue deposited in the Fairytale Town Fund and recommends adoption of a policy for the use of these funds. An amendment to the FY 1986-87 City budget is required for improvements to Fairytale Town and the surrounding area.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

William Land Park is the most heavily used park in the City system. Annual attendance and participation in the multitude of available recreational opportunities is estimated at 3.5 million user days. Fairytale Town, the amusement and pony rides, the Zoo and surrounding parklands have all provided entertainment to several generations of park visitors. In order to continue this tradition of providing quality family recreational opportunities, there is a critical need to reinvest money in William Land Park. Failure to do so could result in an eventual irreversible deterioration of this area.

Fairytale Town has operated as a special fund since FY 1982-83. The Fairytale Town Special Fund provides for the receipt of revenues and the expenditures of funds related to the operation of Fairytale Town and the surrounding area. The special fund approach has enabled Fairytale Town to become 100% operationally self-supporting. Furthermore, as all revenue generated by this facility is utilized to support, market and improve the area, increased attendance and the resultant increase in revenue during the past two years can be attributed to the special fund approach. Included in the revenue deposited in the special fund is the revenue received from the Fairytale Town food and gifts operation.

In recognition of the need to re-invest in William Land Park, the City Council approved, on January 15, 1985, the depositing of revenue from the amusement rides concession into the Fairytale Town Special Fund for this purpose. On April 15, 1986, the depositing of revenue from the pony rides concession into this fund likewise received Council approval. Following these Council actions, Parks and Community Services staff, together with Finance Department staff, developed a plan on the use of this additional revenue to the Fairytale Town Fund, including a hierarchy of uses, fund projections over a five-year period, and a five-year plan for re-investment of revenue into William Land Park.

The basic premise of the hierarchy of uses was that revenue deposited to the Fairytale Town Fund should first be used to support the operations of Fairytale Town (both direct and indirect costs). Previously, revenue deposited in the Fairytale Town Fund was sufficient to cover only the direct costs associated with Fairytale Town. With the addition of the amusement and pony rides concessions revenue to the Fairytale Town Fund, it is now possible to recover all costs associated with Fairytale Town, a practice which is consistent with the accounting principles associated with establishing a special revenue fund. Secondly, the funds will be used for upkeep and enhancement of Fairytale Town, the Zoo and surrounding parklands including the concessions area. The hierarchy of uses of the Fairytale Town fund is further detailed in Attachment A.

The FY 1985-86 Fairytale Town Fund balance was \$191,007 due to the fact that revenue from the amusement and pony rides concessions (\$105,984) was allowed to accumulate pending the development of an expenditure plan. Implementation of the plan, which provides for the recovery of all Fairytale Town indirect costs and for the re-investment of funds into the surrounding area during FY 1986-87 will prevent such a large accumulation of funds in the future while simultaneously maintaining a minimum fund balance. Attachment B details the Fairytale Town Fund projections for the next five fiscal years.

A five year plan for re-investment of revenue into William Land Park has been developed (Attachment C). This plan proposes improvements to Fairytale Town, the Zoo and surrounding area at a funding level consistent with the revenue projections and includes such projects as handicapped access to the concessions, renovation of the duck and boat lakes, and planting at the corner of Land Park Drive and Sutterville Road. Additional projects include landscaping and design of the Japanese gardens in Fairytale Town, correction of potential safety hazards in Fairytale Town, upgrading of the picnic areas, amphitheater and soccer field, and demolition of the old chimp cage. Proposed projects within this plan will be adjusted annually to reflect actual available funds.

FINANCIAL DATA

The Fairytale Town Special Fund, which has operated since FY 1982-83, provides for the receipt of revenue and the expenditures of funds related to Fairytale Town and the surrounding area. The special fund approach has enabled Fairytale

Town to become 100% operationally self-sufficient. Depositing of the revenue from the amusement rides and pony rides concessions in the Fairytale Town Fund provided an additional \$105,111 in revenue in FY 1985-86 and \$56,601 during the first six months of the current fiscal year.

Implementation of the proposed plan detailing the hierarchy of uses for this concession revenue will ensure that revenue deposited to the Fairytale Town Fund is henceforth used to offset both the direct and indirect costs associated with Fairytale Town operations. Indirect costs, previously paid by the General Fund, total \$23,920 for FY 1986-87 and include Zoo Division administrative costs, Administrative Division costs for concession contract administration and Parks Division maintenance costs for the concession areas. Accordingly, this plan will result in an annual savings to the General Fund ranging from \$23,290 in FY 1986-87 up to a projected \$29,226 in FY 1990-91.

The proposed plan allocates funds from the Fairytale Town Special Fund for improvements to Fairytale Town and surrounding area at a level determined by funds available after all Fairytale Town direct and indirect costs are recovered and an appropriate funding balance is retained. In accordance with the plan, FY 1986-87 projects include \$30,000 in capital improvements and \$12,000 in facility maintenance projects for a total of \$42,000.

A detailed listing of the projects follows.
