Title: Supplemental Agreement: Gunfire Detection System

Location: Citywide

Recommendation: Pass a Motion authorizing the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to execute a supplemental agreement with ShotSpotter Inc., in the amount of \$496,513, to continue monitoring services for three gunshot detection systems, for a new agreement amount not to exceed \$1,789,133 through June 15, 2020.

Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The national average for citizens in urban areas to call the police when they hear gunshots is 12%. Additionally, the time delay between the gunshots being fired, the 911 call, and officers being dispatched to the location, may be several minutes. The likelihood of locating suspects, witnesses, and evidence is greatly diminished the longer the response time.

Reducing gun violence is a top policy priority for the Sacramento Police Department (SPD). In an ongoing effort to reduce violent crimes, SPD recommends continuing the utilization of a gunshot detection monitoring system, which has enhanced response times, improved locating suspects and/or witnesses, and the collection of evidence.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations contained in this report are consistent with City Code Section 3.56.290, which requires Council approval of any single supplemental agreement that increases the agreement amount by \$100,000 or more.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): This action concerns administrative and professional activities that will not have a significant impact on the environment, and therefore, does not constitute a "project" as defined by the CEQA Guidelines, per Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378(b)(2).

Commission/Committee Action: Not applicable

Rationale for Recommendation: Currently, there are ShotSpotter systems in three-square mile areas within north and south Sacramento and 1.84 square miles in east Sacramento due to a consistently high volume of gunfire incidents. The first system in north Sacramento was authorized by Council (Resolution 2015-0041) for a one-year period to test the system's effectiveness. Based on the pilot system's accuracy and reliability, Council authorized expansions into south and east Sacramento (Resolutions 2016-0150 and 2017-0364, respectively).

The three ShotSpotter systems throughout Sacramento have proven to be valuable assets when responding to and investigating gun violence. Since the first deployment of the

technology, the SPD has learned that on average, only 25% of ShotSpotter activations are reported to law enforcement by a member of the public.

As a direct result of this technology, the SPD has achieved the following:

Given the success of this technology and the SPD's commitment to keeping Sacramento communities safe from gun violence, staff recommends executing a supplemental agreement with ShotSpotter to extend monitoring services in north, south and east Sacramento to June 14, 2020.

Financial Considerations: Asset Forfeiture, Measure U, and Multi Year Operating Project (MYOP) funding is included for the continuation of the existing ShotSpotter systems in the Fiscal Year 2019/20 Proposed Budget. No General Fund resources are required to support this action.

Local Business Enterprise (LBE): A waiver of the LBE participation requirement was approved based on the fact that this is a sole source procurement and the vendor is not an LBE.
