

REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
NOVEMBER 23, 1951

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at hour of 8:04 o'clock P. M. President Pro Tem Hendren presiding and roll call was answered as follows: Councilmen Bahnfleth, Cooledge, Hendren, Macaulay, Nielsen, Sayre, Seymour, Wood. ABSENT: Mayor Geisreiter.

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member with a copy of proceedings of previous meeting. The minutes of regular meeting of November 15, 1951, were thereupon approved.

Having been continued from date of November 15th to this date, final hearing on Report Hearing (2891) for a Water Distribution System in 64th Street from the Northerly line of 21st Avenue from the Northerly line of 21st Avenue to the center line of Fruitridge Road, was finally considered.
