

RESOLUTION DETERMINING COMPUTATION OF  
DEMANDS FOR INVESTIGATION NO. 2504

WHEREAS, after proceedings duly had and taken by Resolution of Preliminary Determination No. 2504, adopted by the City Council on October 13, 1944, under and pursuant to the provisions of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," this City Council has determined and declared its initial view to be that the contemplated improvement described in said Resolution No. 2504 is one in which the probable assessments will not exceed the limitation set up by said act; and


WHEREAS, the Clerk of this City Council has given notice of the contemplated action of this City Council in the time, form and manner provided by said act above referred to, and has executed and filed an affidavit showing full compliance with the provisions of said act; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That the number of return postcards received in response to said notice, having been computed and tabulated, as a result thereof it is hereby found and determined that the owners of more than 15% of the total area of lands proposed to be assessed for the proposed improvement described in said Resolution No. 2504 have demanded the making of the investigation provided for under the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931."

RESOLUTION APPROVING REPORT AND FIXING TIME AND  
PLACE OF HEARING THEREON NO. 2504

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sacramento did heretofore, and on the 13th day of November, 1944, order the preparation by the City Engineer of the City of Sacramento of a Report under the provisions of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," and covering certain proposed improvements on the alley R-S-21st-22nd Streets

in the City of Sacramento; and

WHEREAS, said Report has been duly completed and presented to this City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

The Clerk of the City Council is hereby ordered and directed to give notice of said hearing in the time, form and manner provided by law.

RESOLUTION No. 2504

RESOLUTION DIRECTING PREPARATION OF  
CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT NO. 2504

WHEREAS, the owners of more than 15% of the total area of property within the district to be assessed for the improvement of the alley between R and S - 21st and 22nd Streets

in the City of Sacramento, have demanded an investigation, which requires a City Engineer's Report containing information as set forth in Section 3 of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931;" .

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Engineer of the City of Sacramento be, and he is, hereby directed to prepare such information as may be required, and make the Report in the form and manner as set forth in said act, covering that certain proposed improvement described in the resolution of said City Council entitled "Resolution of Preliminary Determination of Legislative Body Under 'Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931' No. 2504," heretofore adopted by the said City Council on October 13, 1944, which resolution is hereby referred to for a description of the work.
