SUMP 137 - EMERGENCY GENERATOR (PN: XB56) - PROJECT

APPROVAL AND BID ADVERTISEMENT

LOCATION:

Sump 137, Intersection of Greenhaven Drive and Rush River Drive

(District 7).

SUMMARY

Plans and specifications for this project have been prepared. Approval of the plans and specifications and authorization to advertise for bids is recommended.


RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council approve the plans and specifications for this project and authorize the City Clerk to advertise for bids to be received on August 12, 1992.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Sump 137 is a critical part of the sewage system which requires immediate attention to system failures. This project will establish an emergency generator in a sound-attenuated building to provide auxiliary backup power to the sump in the event of a loss of utility power. The generator will also be mounted on a trailer which will allow it to be moved to other drainage or sewage sumps that experience an extended loss of power. Upon completion of the project, system reliability will be improved in our responsiveness to power failures.

A Negative Declaration was prepared for this project and the Notice of Determination was filed with the County Clerk of the County of Sacramento on June 7, 1990.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The estimated total project cost, including all planning, design and construction costs is \$343,000. The current available funding in CIP #XB56, Sump 137S Auxiliary Power, in the Sewer Fund, is \$97,247, (414-500-XB56-4820). It is proposed that the final budgetary recommendation be made following the receipt of bids.

A non-refundable fee of \$30 will be charged for each set of plans and specifications to offset the cost of reproduction.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This action is consistent with Chapter 58, Article III, Section 58.301 of the City Code concerning advertisement for bid.

MBE/WBE EFFORTS

Plans and specifications will be sent to nineteen (19) plan rooms and construction services organizations for publication and use by the construction industry of Northern California. There are four (4) organizations on the distribution list that are directly involved with MBE/WBE contractors.
