Attached is a resolution by which you approve the submission of an application to the Aetna Life & Casualty Insurance Foundation for \$29,535. The resolution also authorizes the Executive Director to execute the contract upon receipt. The application will be submitted to the United Way, who have been authorized to process the applications for Aetna.

BACKGROUND

The Golden Era Handicraft Cooperative began in November, 1975, and is cooperatively administered by the staff of the Foster Grandparent/Senior Companion Program. Presently 600 senior handicrafters are marketing their handcrafted items through the boutique storefront at 1029 2nd Street. Since the project began \$233,832 has been earned by the senior citizens throughout the eight-county area served. The project is presently funded through an Area 4 Agency on Aging Title III grant and project income.

The additional request for funding is to

- 1) acquire funding to insure continued space in Old Sacramento

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- 2) provide a viable year round outlet for creatively talented physically, mentally and emotionally disabled adults to supplement their incomes through the marketing of their handcrafted items
- 3) to provide vocational training opportunities in retail sales, marketing, and other business related areas for older adults and disadvantaged young persons
- 4) to create a volunteer component of elderly handicrafters who will demonstrate and lecture on traditional handicrafts as a direct tie to our rich heritage to children in educational settings who might otherwise not experience such "lost arts" and passing skills and talents.
- 5) to provide demonstration and presentation by handicapped adults to classroom settings and through on-site visits, to acquaint children with the talents and abilities of handicapped persons thereby reducing misconceptions concerning handicrafts in general.

FINANCIAL DATA

The request for \$29,535 will provide funding for increased space and the creation of a part-time Volunteer and Special Populations Coordinator position as well as monies for printing, volunteer and staff mileage, supplies and accounting fees as delineated in budget. No matching funds are required for the project.


