SUMMARY:

Subsequent to the December 8, 1998 Council approval of the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) grant resolution authorizing the Sacramento Police Department to apply for and accept \$496,000 in funding for the High Technology Demonstration Project Grant, OCJP informed staff that language relieving OCJP of any liability associated with the project was omitted.

The attached resolution, authored by the City Attorney's Office and the Police Department, clearly absolves OCJP of any liability associated with the performance of the grant.

BACKGROUND:

The Office of Criminal Justice Planning has allocated an estimated \$496,000 to the Sacramento Police Department through the Career Criminal Apprehension Program to serve as a demonstration site. Funding would be used to reduce crime due to improved access to data. No city match is required for the two year funding period.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:





RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR AND, IF AWARDED, TO ACCEPT A \$496,000.00 GRANT FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING FOR THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

WHEREAS the Sacramento Police Department desires to implement a project to further develop its infrastructure to integrate data sharing in the investigation and apprehension of multiple and repeat felony offenders;

WHEREAS the award of \$496,000 is to be administered by the State of California, Office of Criminal Justice Planning;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that:

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative is hereby authorized to:
 - a) apply for a grant (High Technology Demonstration Project Grant) on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the State of California, Office of Criminal Justice Planning in the amount of \$496,000.00 to concentrate on the identification and arrest of career criminals and to support the District Attorney's Office in their subsequent prosecution;
 - b) if the grant is awarded, to execute an agreement, which shall include a clause indemnifying the State of California and the Office of Criminal Justice Planning for any liability, including civil actions for damages, arising out of any action taken by the City of Sacramento pursuant to the Grant Award Agreement, and any other documents necessary, subject to approval by the Office of the City Attorney, to accept the award, including any extensions or amendments thereof.
2. The Police Department's staffing level is to be increased by one (1.0 FTE) Police Clerk during the grant period.

3. The Grant Operating Budget will be increased by a total of \$496,000.00 as follows:

4. The Grant Revenue Budget (250-OGR-GXXX-3513) will be increased by \$496,000.00.

5. The Grant Labor Offset for the Police Department's 99/00 Operating Budget has been established as follows:

6. The grant funds received from the State of California shall not be used to supplant City appropriated funds to the Sacramento Police Department.

7. The City of Sacramento shall provide all matching funds required for by the Grant Award Agreement, including any amendment thereof. For the \$496,000 grant award, there are no matching funds required.
