

REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
SEPTEMBER 6, 1962

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at the hour of 7:45 o'clock P. M., Mayor McKinney presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilman Murphy.

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member with a copy of proceedings of previous meeting. The minutes of Regular Meeting of August 30, 1962, were ordered approved.

1717 Mr. William J. Rooney, Jr., recently appointed as a member of the Historic Landmarks Commission, appeared and the City Clerk administered the Oath of Office which was ordered placed on file.

1718 Mayor McKinney introduced Mrs. Richard Stockwell, representing the League of Women Voters and Mrs. Jewell Blucher, member of the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education, who were in the audience.

1720 Hearing on the appeal of the State of California from City Planning Commission action in granting a Special Use Permit for the erection of an apartment house with off-street parking on Lot 8 except the Northerly 40' of same in the Block L - Capitol Avenue, 15th - 16th Streets (Northeast corner of Capitol Avenue and 15th Street), having been rescheduled to this date, Mayor McKinney thereupon instructed the City Clerk to read a communication from Arthur W. Collins, Assistant State Director of Finance in which the State requested the Council to put this matter "off-calendar" pending further advise from the State or the developer.

Upon the suggestion of Councilman Domich, the matter was continued to the regular meeting of September 13, 1962, to enable the Historic Landmarks Commission to comment on the request of the State Division of Highways and the Engineers' recommendation.

Upon hearing report from the City Clerk that the four year term of Beth Shreck, member of the City Retirement Board would expire October 2, 1962, Mayor McKinney announced that nominations for the new term would be in order at the Regular Meeting of September 13, 1962.

Upon the request of City Attorney Everett M. Glenn, the review of Billiard and Pool Parlor Ordinance and Card Room Ordinance was continued to the Regular Meeting of September 20, 1962.
