
Wendy Ceccherelli, Director of Metropolitan Arts, stated that the Cultural Amenities Program operation should be on an optional basis instead of being mandatory. She also gave a report on the progress for development of the cultural amenities policy and stated that the program is not feasible for the City of Sacramento at this time as there is no system in the City that can be readily adapted to include an optional bonus/incentive plan.

Robert Thomas, Director of Parks and Community Services, stated that the Sacramento Metro Arts Commission has been assigned to continue exploring options as part of efforts to improve the built environment. The options to be explored by the Sacramento Metro Arts Commission are (1) an education program about the benefits of cultural amenities (2) Including the Arts Commission in all City/County planning processes and (3) Having the Arts Commission develop ways of providing developers with special public recognition.

Chair Robie asked whether grant money awarded to artists is being sent to them in a timely fashion because she has received a complaint that the money is not being paid. Wendy Ceccherelli will check into the complaint and check back with Chair Robie.
