

REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
JANUARY 29, 1953

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at hour of 8:15 0'clock P. M. Mayor Wood presiding and roll call was answered by the following members: Councilmen Azevedo, Bahnfleth, Culjis, Geisreiter, Hendren, Hicks, Sayre, Seymour, Wood.

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member with a copy of proceedings of previous meeting. The minutes of Regular Meeting of January 22, 1953, were thereupon approved.
