



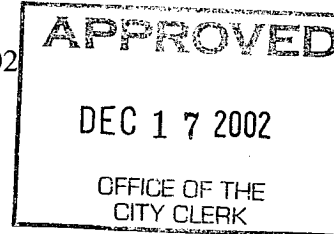

SUBJECT: UPDATE RESOLUTION GRANTING CITATION AND ARREST AUTHORITY TO CERTAIN EMPLOYEES WITHIN THE CODE ENFORCEMENT DIVISION OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENFORCING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE CITY CODE AND/OR STATE LAW

This report recommends that the City Council enact this resolution which updates the names of the staff members who are eligible to be granted Citation and Arrest Authority in the Neighborhood Services Department, Code Enforcement Division.

SUMMARY:

In accordance with Sacramento City Code, Title 2, Chapter 2.12.030 and California Penal Code Section 836.5, the City Council is required to issue a resolution assigning specific persons the authority to enforce codes through means of citation and arrest. The attached resolution provides the names of the specific individuals in the Code Enforcement Division who have received the required training and are recommended for Citation and Arrest Authority.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On June 3, 1997, the City Council adopted resolution 97-285 which granted Citation and Arrest Authority to enforcement staff of the Neighborhood Services Department. The purpose of this authority is to allow enforcement of specified Titles of the Sacramento City Code, California

Vehicle Code, and the California Penal Code. There has been a change in the staffing, and it is necessary to update the list of individuals who shall be granted this authority. The individuals who enforce these codes have met additional training requirements with the City of Sacramento Police Department and are qualified to be granted Citation and Arrest Authority.

This resolution will repeal and replace Section 1 of Resolution 2002-089 enacted on February 19, 2002 with the names of enforcement staff members who are responsible for enforcing Sacramento City Codes related to public nuisance, zoning, litter, signs, noise, swimming pool fences, abandoned vehicles, sidewalk vending, sidewalk displays, pest infestation, and commercial vehicles. This resolution will also repeal and replace Section 3 of Resolution 2002-089 enacted on February 19, 2002 with the names of enforcement staff members who are responsible for enforcing Sacramento City Codes related to public nuisance, substandard structures and dangerous structures.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The granting of Citation and Arrest Authority has no financial impact.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The accompanying resolution of authorization does not constitute a project under CEQA guidelines.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

Section 22500 - Prohibited Stopping, Standing or Parking

- (f) On a sidewalk except electric carts when authorized by local ordinance.

Section 22523 - Abandonment Prohibited

Section 22651 - Circumstances Permitting Removal

- (b) When any vehicle is parked or left standing upon a highway in a position so as to obstruct the normal flow of traffic upon a highway.
- (e) Illegally parked blocking fire hydrant.
- (j) When any vehicle is found illegally parked and there are no license plates or other evidence of registration displayed, vehicle may be impounded.
- (k) When any vehicle is parked or left standing upon a highway for 72 or more consecutive hours in violation of a local ordinance authorizing removal.
- (l) Parked in highway construction, repair, or cleaning area; when notice of removal posted for 24 hours or more.
- (n) Parked or left standing where parking is prohibited, must be posted.
- (o) When any unoccupied vehicle is found upon a highway, public lands, or off-street parking facility, with a registration expiration in excess of six months before the date it is found on the highway.
- (r) When any vehicle is illegally parked and blocks the movement of a legally parked vehicle.

Section 22669 - Removal of Abandoned Vehicles

- (a) When there are reasonable grounds to believe that a vehicle has been abandoned, as determined pursuant to Section 22523, may remove the vehicle from a highway or from public or private property.
- (d) Motor vehicles which are parked, resting, or otherwise immobilized on any highway or public right-of-way and which lack an engine, transmission, wheels, tires, doors, windshield, or any other part or equipment necessary to operate safely on the highways of this

state, are hereby declared a hazard to public health, safety, and welfare and may be removed immediately upon discovery by a peace officer or other designated employee of the state, county, or city.
