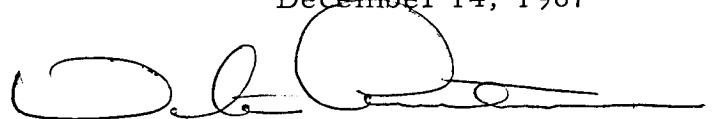
The City Manager questioned the range of recommended increase in the principal administrative classifications and some others.

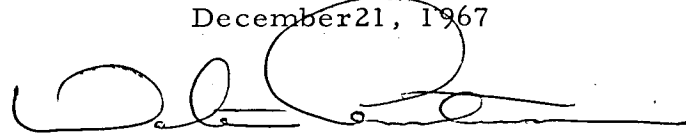
