OCTOBER 11, 1962

Mr. W. G. Stone presented the Quarterly Report, the Port of Sacramento, Sacramento Yolo-Port District, dated October 10, 1962, and discussed the same with the City Council. The report was thereupon placed on file.

Request from A. Teichert & Son, Inc., for approval to remove the name of Luppen and Hawley, Inc., from their list of low bidders on R.O.I., 3603, Guild Estates No. 2, and replace same with Grason Electric Co., together with a letter from Luppen and Hawley, Inc., signifying their acceptance of this procedure, was received and referred to the City Manager for a report.

1971

Notice from the Civil Aeronautics Board relative to Answer to Motion Requesting Expeditious Hearing on Certificate Application in the matter of the application of San Francisco & Oakland Helicopter Airlines, Inc. for a permanent or temporary certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, was received and referred to the City Manager.

1972

Councilman Marriott addressed the Council and moved that Mayor McKinney be granted permission to leave the State of California. Seconded by Councilman Nielsen and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.
