SUBJECT: Continuation of 1985-86 New Works Grant Application -
California Arts Council

SUMMARY

The Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission requests approval for the submission of a grant application to the California Arts Council in the amount of \$18,000 for the continuation and expansion of a sub-grant project for local individual artists.

BACKGROUND

Currently, SMAC is facilitating a \$6,100 grant from the California Arts Council (CAC) to allow local performing and literary artists to develop new works thematically involving the Sacramento area. This year, SMAC is requesting CAC funds to continue direct support to artists and to expand this project in the following ways:

- 1) provide grants to large performing organizations encouraging the incorporation of ethnic/folk and experimental collaborations with smaller appropriate groups;
- 2) provide grants to small performance organizations allowing them to produce small company exchanges through guest residencies, workshops, lecture/demos and performance collaborations within their peer group field.

These two new projects are designed to promote and strengthen performance accessibility, audience development and better representation of non-traditional performance groups which normally have little to no such accessibility.

FINANCIAL DATA

This grant requires a fifty percent (50%) match which SMAC will provide through private corporate donations.
