

ORDINANCE NO. 946, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 239, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED SEPTEMBER 3 1925, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE USE OF SIDEWALKS IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO; DEFINING THE TERM "SIDEWALK"; AS USED IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROHIBITING PROJECTIONS OVER SIDEWALKS, OR THE ERECTION OR MAINTENANCE OF ANY OBSTRUCTIONS THEREON; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR A VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 297, THIRD SERIES, PASSED AUGUST 16TH 1917," BY ADDING A NEW SECTION THERETO TO BE NUMBERED 2a.


BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 239, Fourth Series, passed September 3 1925, is hereby amended by adding a new section thereto to be numbered 2a.

SECTION 2a. Any bicycle, tricycle, or other device moved by human power, placed, left, or deposited on any portion of a sidewalk is a public nuisance. Authority is hereby given to the Police Department to remove such bicycle, etc. and to take it to Police Headquarters and there to impound it.

Any person committing such nuisance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$2.50, and said bicycle, etc. shall not be released until such fine be paid. Such bicycle, etc. may also be released upon the depositing with the Clerk of the Police Court only bail in said amount of \$2.50. Said bail, upon good cause shown, may be returned by said Clerk upon the suggestion of the Chief of Police.
