**SUBJECT: NORTHGATE BOULEVARD/PATIO AVENUE TRAFFIC SIGNAL
PROJECT(PN:SJ66)- AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSFER FUNDS**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

South Natomas. Council District 1.

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution which transfers \$160,000 from the South Natomas Community Improvement Fund (SNCIF) to the Northgate Boulevard/Patio Avenue Traffic Signal Project.

SUMMARY:

The project will construct a new traffic signal at the intersection of Northgate Boulevard/Patio Avenue and extend Patio Avenue westerly from Northgate Boulevard to Larchwood Drive.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

None.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Funding was established for a traffic signal at Northgate Boulevard/Turnstone Drive. However, due to children safety concerns, signal coordination issues, and overwhelming community support, staff recommends that funding be used to construct a traffic signal at Northgate Boulevard/ Patio Avenue along with the extension of Patio Avenue, westerly to Larchwood Drive. Patio Avenue will have curb, gutter, sidewalk and streetlights. The land needed to construct the Patio Avenue extension was donated by developers.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The estimated total project cost is \$315,000. The existing project budget is \$160,000. The remaining unencumbered balance is \$155,000. Additional funding in the amount of \$160,000 is required from the South Natomas Community Improvement Fund.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Environmental documentation will be performed prior to project construction.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:


