RESOLUTION No. 268

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

January 31, 1947

WHEREAS, a joint meeting was held in the City Council Chambers of the City of Sacramento on Wednesday, January 22, 1947, between the members of the City Council and other governmental bodies within the metropolitan area of this city, for the purpose of discussing their joint sewage disposal problems which now need immediate attention, and that as a result of this meeting, it was the consensus of opinion of those in attendance that by cooperative measures a satisfactory solution of these problems can be accomplished for the benefit of all concerned; and

WHEREAS, in the territory south of the city, and adjacent to it, there is now in existence County Sanitation District No. 1, and that it is to the best interests of the City and this district that they mutually agree to jointly solve their overall sewage disposal problems and particularly the means necessary to solve sewage problems of immediate necessity in that vicinity,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that it is the sense of the Council of the City of Sacramento that it enter into joint negotiations with County Sanitation District No. 1 for an overall solution of their sewage disposal problems and that the City Manager, City Engineer, and City Attorney be authorized to enter into immediate negotations with the proper authorities from this district to determine maintenance costs, capital expenditures and the form of agreements necessary to enter into final negotiations in a manner satisfactory to solving the sewage disposal problems of both the City and the County Sanitation District No. 1, and that it be further resolved that the Committee appointed by the Mayor at the meeting on January 22, 1947, be authorized to enter into such preliminary negotiations as may result from this resolution.
